There will be \$7,500 in cash and prizes!

In addition, there is a Car Show on Saturday from 9:00 - 5:00, in Wilbur Park, right next to the action, entertainment and BBQ competition. A donation of children's books or cash for Rotary sponsored literacy programs is encouraged. The park is located at 1100 Colorado Street in Boulder City.

There is no admission, and they will have entertainment Friday and Saturday nights. During the day on Saturday there will also

RI Council on Legislation by Art Harrington

Council enacts changes in Rotary

Rotary's Council on Legislation was held in Chicago April 22-27, 2007. Every three years 530 representatives, one from each Rotary district

around the world, come together to represent more than 32,000 clubs in 169 countries and 37 geographical territories to determine the future shape of Rotary - both for the next three years, and usually far beyond.

Over these six days last month, 336 proposed enactments and resolutions were presented, debated and voted on. The decisions that were made will determine the course of Rotary, as we seek to remain viable and meet the needs and challenges of an ever-changing world.

There were some significant decisions and changes made at this COL. I was most interested in one of them, Enactment 07-329. It was a proposal my Springerville Rotary Club had cosponsored with a Colorado Rotary club 3 years ago. It didn't quite pass then, but this time Past RI President Cliff Dochterman came to speak on its behalf. Cliff had this to say:

"We have now passed 8 items. We have added a comma here and an extra word there, but have yet to take any action to move Rotary forward into the future. Sometimes there is a good idea whose time has come. Up to now we have been solving past problems. Now is the moment to move Rotary's membership forward. This is our moment to make a difference!

"In every community there are men and women who have a life of service. These people serve schools, hospitals, museums, universities, youth activities, environmental groups, religious centers and other civic societies. These community volunteers belong in Rotary.

"We were within a few votes of attaining the 2/3rds vote needed to pass this Enactment at our last council 3 years ago. Now is the time to make a real contribution to Rotary. I urge you to open the door to Rotary for community leaders who are dedicated volunteers."

The item, which passed this time 440 to 53, recognizes the importance of local volunteers who have a lifetime of experience in service, and allows us to welcome them into Rotary. Who in our community do you know like that who should be a member of our club?

It's a fact: When Cliff speaks, Rotary listens! Thank God we still have such respected visionaries among us! Rotary continues to get better because of them.
