Approves revised club constitution and bylaws



Laura Grasse, presiding over our club forum at last Thursday's meeting, presented her new board, a proposed budget for 2007-08 of \$105,809 and asked the club to adopted a revised club constitution and bylaws.

First Rotary World Peace Symposium by Art Harrington



RI Convention will hold first Rotary SALT LAKE CITY World Peace Symposium

A Rotary World Peace Symposium is slated for June 14-16, just before the 2007 RI Convention kicks off in Salt Lake City. The event marks the first time a symposium will be held in conjunction with an RI Convention.

The symposium will honor The Rotary Foundation's 90th anniversary celebration and the 10th anniversary of the launch of the Rotary Centers for International Studies in peace and conflict resolution. Located at seven leading universities around the world, Rotary Centers provide fellows the chance to study in a master's-level program in conflict resolution, peace studies, international relations, and other related disciplines.

The agenda includes a retrospective of the program's first decade and penels on how the work of these scholars is affecting conflicts worldwide. Participants will also get the change to network and attend regional alumni events.

Most symposium events will be held at the Salt Palace Convention Center and are open to alumni and fellows. The \$250 registration fee includes the symposium, dinner on June 14, and alumni registration for the convention. Interested Rotarians and friends registered for the convention may attend for an additional fee of \$150 and join the dinner for \$50.

Meet Rotary World Peace Fellow, Maria Effendi

Maria is 27 years of age and is from Islamabad,
Pakistan. She a Class V Rotary World Peace
Fellow, pursuing a Master of Arts in Conflict Resolution at The
Department of Peace Studies, University of Bradford, in
England.

Prior to becoming a Rotary World Peace Fellow, Maria worked for 6 years as a social science researcher focusing on conflict resolution initially at the University of Karachi, and then at the Institute of Regional Studies in Islamabad. She has been accepted to conduct her summer applied field experience (internship) with the Stockholm International Peace Research Institute, in Sweden, where she will carry out a research study tentatively entitled "Implications of Iran's Nuclear Issues for Pakistan."

Her career plans are to be an expert and practitioner of conflict resolution and crisis management in South East Asia, and bridge the gap between academics and policy makers in Pakistan.
