# Changing lives - eliminating poverty



A cooperative of seamstresses in the mountain village of San Juan del Rio Coco in Nicaragua received six sewing machines and fabric from the Rotary Club of Rancho Bernardo Sunrise in San Diego, California.

The co-op has used the pedal-operated machines to provide free sewing lessons to over 40 women, who have used their skills to produce and sell clothing.

Casa Materna, a village shelter for expectant mothers, is using one machine to teach women to sew cloth diapers and blankets.

Rotarian Nasrin Barbee led the San Diego club's effort to raise \$2,500 for the sewing machines and other supplies for Casa Materna.

Every great project always begins with one Rotarian and one Rotary club. The sun never sets on Rotary and its accomplishments around the globe. Rotarians are making a difference!
