PRESENTATION: CJ Meldahl: People Who Care

CJ Meldahl has served as the Executive Director for People Who Care for four years. Having spent the majority of her life in Minnesota, she came to Arizona after an 11 year tenure at the University of Minnesota, School of Public Health. While there she worked in clinical research focused on Heart Disease & Atherosclerosis, CJ holds a graduate degree in Aging & Gerontology. People Who Care is a nonprofit organization that provides transportation and other non-medical services at no charge to Neighbors in the Quad Cities who are no longer able to drive due to age, vision issues, or disabilities. This assistance enables them to safely & successfully age in place, access essentials like healthcare and food & enjoy an enriched quality of life. People Who Care relies on volunteers to provide door-through-door transportation, to escort our Neighbors on errands and appointments. They also offer friendly visits & phone calls, non-medical family caregiver relief, technology assistance, home safety assessments, minor home repairs, & personal paperwork assistance for neighbors with impaired vision or memory issues. Perhaps their most important role of the volunteers is to build meaningful connections that reduce loneliness & isolation. A conversation that began around a kitchen table in Chino Valley has evolved into an organization that serves the Quad-City region. Volunteers also help with fire extinguisher, smoke detector inspection & replacement, along with "bump dots" to aid those with vision impairments. A new program that introduced online food order services to clients resulted in avoiding \$7,800 in annual delivery fees.
