The vision is to be the leader in premier career & technical education. All programs are free for students enrolled in grades 10-12. MICTED programs are open to current high school students attending classes through public, charter, private & home schools within Yavapai County. Along with full tuition being paid by MICTED, students receive career guidance & job search support along with professional trade certifications upon program completion. Students participating in MICTED programs also attend traditional high school classes. Upon graduation, many students have earned Associate of Arts degrees through the Yavapai & Northern Arizona universities.
