• Diane Meek invited members to share anecdotes regarding Linda Sweeney's tenure as club president. Donna Phillips will collect the cards at the end of today's meeting. Rex Townsend thanked everyone that contributed to The Rotary Fund throughout the previous year. Lisa Doherty brought attention to a Daily Courier article featuring Joe Sweeney's induction as the 5495 District Governor. She shared that the Courier will soon print an article to feature the four Prescott area Rotary clubs. Duane Robinson shared Service Slate sign ups are "looking good." Wendi Lancy provided an overview of service projects completed throughout the previous year. She shared that 32 projects were completed, involving 388 Rotary volunteers, 86 non-Rotarian volunteers to equal 4,285.5 volunteer hours. A total of 1,965 items were donated to benefit the Teen's Closet, Teachers Closet, Salvation Army, among others. Total value of donations was \$64,801.00 primarily from the Grapes for Good fundraiser. Our club's service projects impacted 516 students, 12 mothers, 55 seniors & 210 teachers. Over 50,000 community members were recipients of support offered through the Community Cupboard program. Our participation in the Granite Creek clean up resulted in 1.3 tons of waste being removed from this community resource. Wendi shared that during the month of July, members are encouraged to donate supplies for the Teen's Closet. Supplies, such as toiletries & clothing make a significant impact on the lives of high school students that would otherwise go without these basic necessities. **KEEP UP THE GREAT WORK!**
