PRESENTATION: Lesley Jenkins - Alzheimer's Association Northern Arizona, part of the Desert Southwest Chapter

Lesley's husband, Rodeny, spoke here last week. She and her husband moved with kids to Prescott. It is an honor to share the work for Alzheimer's association. In Arizona there are 150,000 people living with Alzheimer's that have been diagnosed. 262,000 caregivers providing their support. Every time you blink twice or every 60 seconds someone is diagnosed with Alzheimer's in the USA. Alzheimer's is the most prevalent form of dementia. They speak to all aspects of dementia. Before Covid it was considered the most expensive disease. It's not just an old persons disease. Diagnosis can be earlier than retirement age. It shows no age or demographic preference. Age can be a factor and is more common but is not a normal sign of aging. It is NOT a mental health disease but is a medical disease. Most caregivers are daughters and they have had to quit work to handle the care needed. No one needs to go through this journey alone. The Alzheimer's Association offers a variety of services and education to help cope with it. They have a 24/7 help-line available speaking 200 languages as a support system of caregivers at 800-272-3900. They also have virtual programs available for support. The Walk to End Alzheimer's will be at Yavapai College Oct. 2 and there is also a virtual walk. For more info go to www.alz.org.
