<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Dave Diggle

Dave Diggle submitted the financial summary for December 2019 and the updates to the club's Fiscal Year 2019-20 budget. Significant changes to the budget resulted from the loss of Hickory Creek Nursing Home and Sheridan Auctioneers as corporate members. This has resulted in the estimated budget loss increasing to \$2,287.72. The previous estimate loss was approximately \$600. The financial reports are attached.

International Service Report: Abe Alassaf

Abe Alassaf provided paperwork for Tom Gibbs and Ed Peterson to sign for Hanna Bernstein's short term trip. Abe Alassaf also reported that there is a student, Alesa (?), interested in a long term trip next year. Alesa is currently working to identify 2 additional host families. Tom Gibbs, as the Athens School Superintendent, has agreed to coordinate the long term inbound student's school assignments which could involve 3 districts. Abe Alassaf will set up a time for Alesa to address the club and talk about her desire to travel overseas with Rotary.

President Comments: Tom Gibbs

Dolly Parton Imagination Library & Local Rotary Joint Literacy Project

Tom Gibbs reported that the State has offered to cover ½ the cost of this project if the counties can match the State's grant. Tom Gibbs estimated that the maximum cost to Athens County, if 100% of eligible students participated, would be \$30k. However, based on experience in other states, it is more likely that Athens would have 50% participation which would mean a fund raising target of closer to \$15k. Becky Filar, with the Sun Rise Club is heading up a grant writing effort to acquire support from Rotary District. Tom Gibbs suggested that this grant money could be dedicated to the Dolly Parton Imagination Library. Dave Diggle stated that a proposal would need to be made to the Athens Rotary Foundation with the estimated funding required. Several organizations have been approached to contribute.

Mike Noel reported that he received notification of a Rotary District grant of \$500 but he was unclear what the grant covered. Dave Diggle suggested that it was likely for the Thanksgiving food baskets. Shane Jarrett offered to verify this at the next Athens Foundation Board Meeting.

Donation of \$150 for Hospitality Suite @ District Conference

A motion was made to decline the \$150 donation request to support the Hospitality Suite by Tom Gibbs and seconded by Dave Diggle with unanimous approval.

The Big Project Information from Jenny Stotts

Tom Gibbs provided information on the Big Project that Jenny Stotts is leading as the ADG. At this time Tom Gibb's intent was to ensure that the board was aware of the March 28<sup>th</sup> date for the "Big Project" and recommending our club's participation.

There was extensive discussion concerning the club's membership decline and what actions the board should take. The several existing proposals were discussed but a consensus was not achieved. Encouraging members to actively recruit new members was strongly advocated. Tara Gilts suggested that the Board Members commit to bringing in one new member each over the next year. There was consensus around the idea of dedicating one regular meeting to discuss the club's business/activities. This would provide a venue to engage the club members in the discussion.
