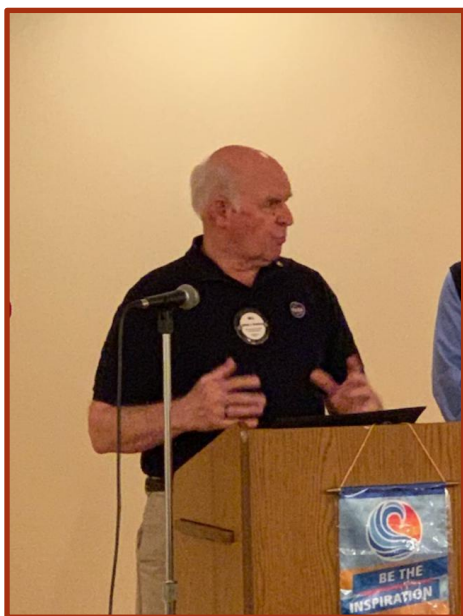

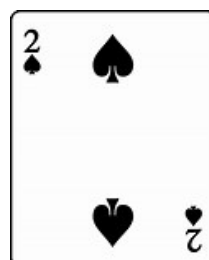

Q: From 1969-72 NASA had two missions per year except for 1970. Why is that?

A: Apollo 13 service module malfunction and the Space program required introspection.

Program

Tim Gaffney – longtime Miamisburg resident and director of the National Aviation Heritage Area gave the program. He said we are celebrating the 50th anniversary of the Apollo Mission's beginning.



The quest for landing a person on the moon started on May 25, 1961 when President John F. Kennedy announced the goal to reach the moon before the end of the decade.

Tim said that the United States program owes its history to Ohio in several ways.

Astronauts: John Glenn, Neil Armstrong, Jim Lovell

The Apollo program was named by Abe Silverstein from the Lewis Space Center in Cleveland.

The fourth stage engine that propelled space craft outside of Earth's orbit was developed at Lewis. The technology enabled the use of liquid oxygen and liquid hydrogen for lightweight fuel.

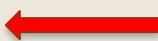
The enormous tractor that moves modules to the launch pad were developed and manufactured at Marion Steam Shovel in Marion, Ohio.

Tim reminded everyone that without energy research and development at the Mound labs, much of the space program would not have succeeded.
