On the "Contact details" page, enter the information shown. A red asterisk (*) is required information. Click on the blue "Continue to Guests" bar at the bottom. On the "Guests" page, you will see your ticket(s) listed individually. The first ticket is marked for the purchaser (by name and email). Any additional tickets are marked "Unknown guest". Purchasers will need to click on "Edit" to add your guest's first and last name (other boxes are optional). Once completed, click on the blue "Continue to review" bar at the bottom.

On the "Review checkout" page, verify your purchase(s) and click on the check box to "agree to the terms of use" and then click on the blue "Enter Payment Details" bar at the bottom.

From there, enter your credit card information and follow the instructions. It's all pretty simple and straight forward.

- 3. On the home page, a donation section is provided for those who would like to donate (with or without ticket purchase). They would then "Add to cart" and "Proceed to checkout" as above.
- 4. Upon completion and submission of your payment, you will receive an email confirmation.
- 5. We have a limit of 150 tickets available, so please make your order and payment before the website is publicized for other purchasers
- 6. All tickets will be available for pick-up during check-in at the door. This will help avoid lost, misplaced, or forgotten tickets.
- 7. We have elected to absorb the credit card fees, so your purchase / donation amount will not change.

The form can be turned in before the item is delivered (encouraged). This will allow us to input the information into the auction website.

Items may be brought into a meeting or delivered to Judy's office.

Larger items should be delivered to Judy's office.

PLEASE CALL AHEAD TO ENSURE SHE IS AVAILABLE TO ACCEPT DELIVERY

We ask that ALL items be turned in by Thursday 28 May.

Once items are turned in, the descriptions will be verified for completeness, and photographed for the auction website.
