Building Bridges is a Non-Profit Organization formed in 1974 to work with disadvantaged youth. The purpose of the organization is to give these troubled youths the services and support that they need to work through their issues. In 2014 the organization provided services to 458 such youths and their families.

They help the youths build their self-esteem which helps keep them from returning to court and helps them progress their education. One unique way that they help their clients is through a work therapy program. The youths' work 16 hours a week for \$3 an hour which teaches them a work ethic, gives them a little spending money, and helps them develop skills. A part of this Work Therapy Program is the Sons of Thunder Tract where the kids learn to work on cars. If they stick with it they can earn their own toolbox and even earn certifications to make them more employable.
