Bill Skudlarek introduced Chuck King from the Centerville Rotary. Chuck's presentation highlighted a project Centerville is heavily involved in --- Operation Warm.

Operation Warm was started in Philadelphia by Dick Stanford. Centerville Rotary has worked this service project for four years.

Centerville works with District 6670 to receive matching money to buy coats for children in the greater Miami Valley. The coats are bought wholesale, in bulk, and distributed locally through efforts of Hannah's Treasure Chest "enriching the lives of children in need."

Chuck said that for just \$18 per coat, children can stay warm while waiting for a school bus or playing on the playground. Centerville's project has distributed 1800 coats in the last four years.



Accompanying Chuck was Sarah from Hannah's Treasure Chest. She praised Centerville's efforts in keeping kids warm through their great work with Operation Warm.

Justin was happy that a couple celebrated their 50th wedding anniversary at Star City -- the same building they were married in -- the old Peerless Mill.

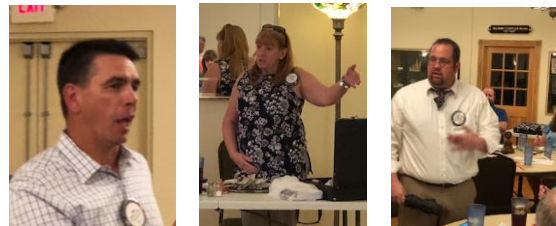
Rich Gulling was happy that his nephew is interviewing for med school at Yale. And another happy because football season was starting.
