

# WHITEHALL ROTARY CLUB

## Rotary and Membership Information

### What is Rotary?

Rotary is the world's first service club. There are five possible avenues of service.

1. CLUB: Providing service to the local Club to enable it to run efficiently in the spirit of fellowship.
2. VOCATIONAL: Putting high standards of conduct into practice in the business and professional lives of Rotarians and showing young people the type of work and activities involved in various occupations.
3. COMMUNITY: Identifying community needs and addressing these needs with service projects; and,
4. INTERNATIONAL: Working for international understanding and peace by promoting goodwill between all people.
5. YOUTH: Providing support and development for youth.

### What is My Obligation?

- A. *Productive Involvement:* Meetings are held every Monday evening (except holidays) at 6:15 PM. Dinner is optional but encouraged. Regular attendance is important to the core of the Club. When programs are brought in, and especially from out of town, it is important to have a good reception for these people. Each member is asked to arrange for at least one and probably two programs during the year. This can be given by the member or by a guest of the member. The member is responsible for covering the cost of the speaker's dinner, tip, and wheel chips. **Speakers must be given a time limit of 20 to no more than 30 minutes. Special programs can be longer if arrangements are made in advance with the club.** The club president usually determines the program schedule. If you are unable to provide a program on your scheduled day, it is your responsibility to change dates with another member. Controversial or solicitation programs are not recommended. Members are asked to consider being a sustaining member or an "Every Member Every Year" of the RI Foundation if possible which is a \$100 contribution per year to the Foundation or at any contribution every year.
- B. *Membership:* Membership is by invitation only and typically has one representative of each business, profession, or institution in a community. The intent of the membership policy is to ensure a cross section of the community's business and professional life is represented.
- C. *Attendance:* Requirements set by Rotary International (RI) are as follows: RI promotes 100% attendance. If a person fails to attend at least 50% of the club meetings, membership could be discontinued unless the member is specifically excused by the club. Meetings can be "made-up" by attending meetings at other clubs, by e-meetings on line, and by participating in club service projects.
- D. *Meet the Dues Requirement:* As of January 1, 2016, \$125.00 per year or the total of the RI and District dues they are to be paid Jan 1, or semi-annually on Jan 1, & July 1; dues are prorated from the time a Rotarian is inducted. Members are encouraged to participate in the weekly Wheel pot which is the purchase of 2 chips for \$1; the money from this 50-50 activity helps to cover various designated expenses. Every 3 years members must pay \$11.00 for a background check for risk management.
- E. *Contribute Innovative Ideas* Related to SERVICE ABOVE SELF.
- F. *New Members:* Ask other leaders in our community to join the Whitehall Rotary Club we would like every member to sponsor a member. When inviting someone to join, the club pays for their meal during the first visit. A prospective member may visit several times and should be told that after the first meeting, they will be responsible for their dinner expense unless they are invited to give a program by a member.

- G. *Enjoy the Experience of Community Service and Fellowship by Participating in Rotary Activities:* These include club service projects, the District Assembly, the District Conference, the annual Peace Park Celebration and other Rotary functions.

- ❖ We periodically sponsor a foreign exchange student to study in Whitehall.
- ❖ Sponsor students to attend Girls and Boys State.
- ❖ Sponsor students to attend the Rotary Youth Leadership camp, RYLA.
- ❖ Sponsor high school Interact Club.
- ❖ Recognize local businesses and people for their contributions to Rotary and/or the community by donating a wheelchair in their honor through the Wheelchair Foundation. Money is raised through a donation jar at the KFC/A&W.
- ❖ Contribute to the Rotary Foundation which sponsors humanitarian efforts throughout the world.
- ❖ Past participation in Rotary's Group Study Exchange (GSE). This was a program in which young business professionals from foreign countries visit Rotary clubs in another country and learn about culture and similar professions. The Whitehall club has hosted GSE teams from Japan, Germany, Pakistan, South East Africa, Brazil, and Tasmania, Australia.
- ❖ Christmas Stroll fundraiser with dish cloth sale.
- ❖ We are the information booth for the Frontier Days celebration.
- ❖ We sell the Community Calendar as a fundraiser and community service project.
- ❖ Participate in the Jefferson River Rally

## **Expectations of Whitehall Rotary Club Members:**

### **A. ATTENDANCE:**

1. Attend at least 50% of all meetings each half of the year
2. Make up meetings
  - a. Attend other club meetings and bring make up slip (like RJ)
  - b. Do an E-Club make up meeting online.
  - c. Club Projects & Service count as meetings-(Rotary Booth, Work on Fish Pond, etc.)

### **B. DUES:**

1. Pay Dues either annually, semi-annually on Jan.1 & July 1

### **C. SERVICE PROJECTS AND FUNDRAISERS:**

1. Each member is expected to participate in at least 1 project and 1 fundraiser.
2. Each member is expected to be an active member on at least one committee.
3. Each Member is expected to be in charge of at least 2 meals per year.

### **D. PROGRAMS:**

1. Each member is expected to sponsor at least 1 or 2 programs per year as needed by giving a program themselves or by having another party present the program.
2. Program sponsor shall:
  - a. Pay for the meal of the party giving the program whether that party is a club member or not.
  - b. Pay for the Spin the Wheel chips and tip for the party giving the program whether that party is a club member or not.
  - c. If a program requires 2 presenters the Club will pay for 1 party, sponsor for the other party.
  - d. If program requires a large # of participants Club will assist with the above on a case by case basis discussed beforehand.
  - e. Spouses, family members and friends of program party are welcome but their meals are not furnished member needs to pay for them.

### **E: FOUNDATION**

1. We encourage each member to become a sustaining member of \$100 per year or at least contribute something to the TRF each year with Every Rotarian Every Year.
