



BOZEMAN SUNRISE ROTARY COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES

Glen Lake Rotary Park (GLRP – Bob Farrington & Joe Souther)

Over the past 30 years, BSRC has built and helped maintain a large beach, restroom concession building, park fencing, picnic pavilions, docks, and a bridge as well as planting trees and restoring the stream that connects to the East Gallatin River.

Fix Up Festival (FUF – Alfons Staerk)

FUF is a community project organized by Sunrise Rotary where service organizations and businesses repair homes for low-income, elderly, disabled and Veterans. Over the past 13 years, we have completed more than 125 projects, an average of 12 homes annually.

Youth Services (Anne Keith)

Interact is sponsored at the Bozeman High School that promotes Rotary values and engages students in community service.

Rotaract is a young adult club intended to get early career community members engaged with Rotary values and community service..

Rotary Youth Leadership Awards is an annual summer camp for high school sophomores which focuses on leadership development and Rotary values.

Rotary Youth Exchange encourages Rotary clubs to sponsor high school students going overseas and to help host foreign students coming here.

Vocation-Education (Ted Schmidt)

2nd Grade Book Give Away annually provides two books delivered by Sunrise Rotarians to all public and private school second graders in Gallatin County.

Homeless or Housing Sensitive High School Support donates \$6,000 in \$25 gift cards to each of Bozeman, Gallatin and Belgrade high schools for students vetted by high school counselors to help them buy food or gas to get to work.

Scholarships are for Bozeman High School seniors attending post-graduation training or education. We provide four \$2,000 scholarships to Bozeman High Seniors (3 from Bridger Academy & 1 for a Student of the Month) which are administered by the Bozeman Schools Foundation.

Blueprint Obstacle Adventure Race (BOAR) is a fundraiser for HRDC's Blueprint house which provides housing for high school students experiencing homelessness and at Glen Lake Rotary Park in August.

Kids Fishing Day (Terry Thompson)

is open to all kids ages 3 – 13 and their families. We clean up the lake and shore, pre-stock it with fish, and provide prizes and lunch for everyone.

International Activities (Mary Hubbard)

Nepal -we collaborate with the Rotary Club of Tripureswor, Kathmandu on an education-focused Rotary Global Grant project. Through this grant, we provide teaching training to 6 K-12 schools in and around Kathmandu.

Kenya - a project in 4 communities, specifically with women's groups, to repair water wells and manage community water, introduce solar water pumping systems, work with women's groups to establish community horticulture and train them on business opportunities and skills and women's rights.
