



Since our founding in 1992, Bozeman Sunrise Rotary Club - whose motto is 'Service Above Self' - meets each Friday morning at 6:45am and consists of 120 engaged and motivated members representing dozens of business, academic, non-profit and professional classifications that supports the worldwide mission of Rotary International.

Our service is local, regional and international, drawing from funds raised here in Montana, and matched with grants from over 46,000 partner clubs in over 200+ countries and territories around the globe.

Our Local Service in 2022

For 30 years, we've partnered with the City of Bozeman to build and maintain Glen Lake Rotary Park (aka Bozeman Beach) as a fun, safe and enjoyable community resource. We host 400+ parents and kids each May for FREE KIDS FISHING DAY, providing equipment, bait lunch and prizes.

In 2023, working with the City of Bozeman, we will oversee the building of a new east entrance road into the Park.

To promote early child literacy, Rotary members visited nearly every 2nd grade classroom throughout Gallatin County (public and private) and donated 2,100 books to over 1,300 students.

We funded high school scholarships, a leadership camp, recognize & award 'Students of the Month' at Bozeman High School, mentor high school-aged leaders (through Interact) and young professionals (through Rotaract)

Sunrise Rotary donated \$6,000 in gift cards to each of Bozeman, Gallatin and Belgrade High Schools. These cards are shared by counselors with students experiencing homelessness and food insecurity. Additionally, individual members funded and delivered over 100 sets of boots, coats and pants to area elementary, middle and high school students.

Through our annual Fix-Up Festival, we coordinated the repair of two roofs and 11 homes free-of-charge for low-income, seniors and veterans, while partnering with dozens of businesses, sponsors, and nearly 100 volunteers (**We are taking 2023 applications right now**).



Our International Service

Club members visited and volunteered in service to schools in Nepal, providing an additional \$155,000 for educational materials and teacher training. We are also helping to fund a clean water project in Kenya.

Once Ukraine came under fire, individual members donated \$17,000 in relief funds for locals and refugees.
