Attendance

- Try to maintain at minimum 50% between weekly meetings and make-up service projects
- Breakfast check-in process
- Make-up process – Visit other clubs
- Reporting make-ups
- Leave of Absence, Dismissal or Resign



Attendance

- If member cannot make meeting at their home club, they can attend a virtual meeting of another club or in-person at these nearby Clubs:

Bozeman Noon Club – Manhattan –
Big Sky - Livingston

Red to Blue Badge – try to complete in 90-120 days

1. Attend a new member orientation with mentor or proposer
2. Read: ***The ABCs of Rotary (in print or online)***
3. Tell us about yourself at scheduled club meeting
4. Attend a Board of Directors meeting
5. Participate in a club service project
6. Attend a meeting at another club
7. Expand Rotary by Inviting a guest or proposing a new member
8. Attend a ROTARACT or INTERACT meeting, project or social
9. Wear the red badge a minimum of three months.
10. Select and join one of the Sunrise Rotary Club Committees
11. Serve as a greeter at club meeting



Dues are \$130/Q++

* ++ = cost of meals that you agree to pay for. When inviting guests to breakfast, it is expected that the member cover the cost of the guest's meal as a courtesy to them



Avenues of Service within the club

Community – meets monthly and oversees:

Weekly Meals on Wheels – Tuesday Lunch (2 members, driver & nav)

Glen Lake Rotary Park (GLRP) – aka Bozeman Beach (we est'd in 1992 – all year, committed \$450k+ over 30 years)

Kids Fishing Day – 3rd Saturday of May at GLRP, Free to everyone

Fix-Up Festival – rehabilitate 10+ homes – typically September

** - Combine with Rotaract to help MSU Vets in Career Counseling



Avenues of Service

Vocational / Educational – meet monthly

Homeless Student service – Financially support housing thru Blueprint home, gift cards to students for food/fuel, promote BOAR Race

Spring Book Giveaway – we deliver and giveaway books to all 2nd graders in Gallatin County to promote literacy. We volunteer 60-90 mins at one of 30+ schools (April and May)

Provide scholarships to area HS students to continue training and education in their future fields



Avenues of Service

Public Relations – meet monthly

Intra-Club member communications (website and weekly bulletin)

Educate the community through publishing online, print and broadcast content through our media partners

Help club members tap Rotary's branding tools to widen their footprint

Help committees coordinate communications with sponsors and donors to improve their service efforts



Avenues of Service

International – meets periodically

Provide micro-grants for local (Montana-based) service initiatives we seek from local sources

Seek international partners to work on Rotary's 5 areas of service (water & sanitation, literacy & education, promoting peace, saving mothers & children, growing local economies and fighting disease)

Have opportunity to oversee International grant project on our behalf in another country



Avenues of Service

Youth – monthly and when needed

Sponsor and Mentor teens (16-18) through high school Interact Club

Sponsor and Mentor young professionals (19-35) through Rotaract Club

Support and teach leadership to teens through RYLA

High school exchanges for school year, we send one, we receive one



Avenues of Service

Foundation Giving – meet monthly

Promote charitable giving to support Rotary worldwide service priorities

Recognize members publicly for their generosity

Assist committees in tapping local and world-wide Rotary grants

Participate in raising money to end Polio through Polio Plus



Avenues of Service

Membership – last Wednesday each month

Coordinate recruiting efforts for the club

Develop member retention strategies and monitor attendance

Train members in orientations – ongoing workshops

Ensure good engagement from members

Seek member diversity



Avenues of Service

Resource – meet monthly

Coordinate member communications among our larger supporters

Seek new fundraising opportunities to share with members

Work with PR committee – create materials to help other committees

Assist committees with budgeting support and human resources

Securing Speakers

- Weekly programs are the bedrock of member engagement
- Suggest a speaker/topic to Pres-Elect within 12 months
- Seek people you would like to hear from. **Can be in person or via Zoom**
- No soliciting for money or help from non-profits
- For-Profits not to pitch for business - inform about your industry and market dynamics
- We provide a PC laptop for presenting



Recruiting new Members

- No classification can be more than 10% of total membership (example: banking)
- Qualifications – a proposed member should demonstrate good character, integrity, and leadership; possess good reputation within their business, profession, and/or community; and are willing to serve in their community and/or around the world. Or, are Rotary alumnus*
- Here is the process to propose a new member....

BSRC Members - let's all give thought to WHO we think might qualify to have their home fixed-up this coming fall as we start the process of



1. Submit candidate proposal form to membership committee
(We request that they have lived and worked here at least one-year prior to being proposed)
2. Committee reviews, and approves or denies
3. Board reviews, and approves or denies
4. Candidate is read 2x to general membership
5. 7 days after 2nd reading, proposer is notified
6. If approved, invite them to meeting or event as your guest
7. If interested, give membership application & requirements



Proposer's Role

- Your responsibility as a new member proposer:
 - Attend induction ceremony
 - Attend proposer orientation training
 - Assist member through their Red to Blue process
 - Stay in touch – be aware of their attendance
 - Be their mentor for at least 1st year
