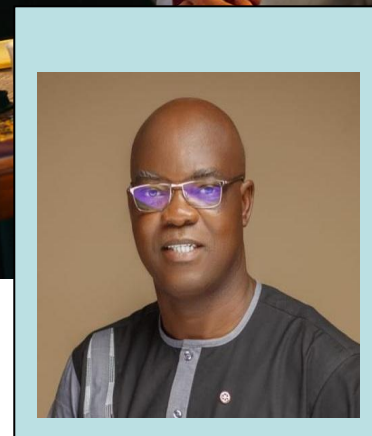

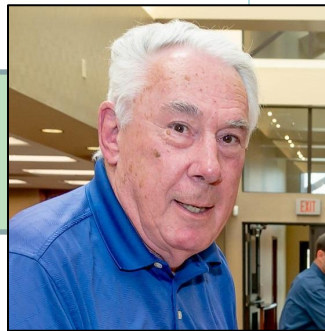

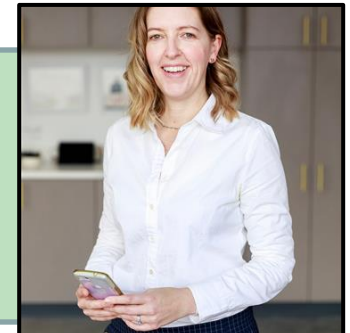

Attendance

- Attend or make-up at least 33% of regular club meetings, and engage in at least 12 hours of service each half-year, or a combination
- Cannot miss 4 consecutive meetings without cause - board has discretion to terminate your membership
- Breakfast check-in process
- Dismissal or Resignation
- Medical Leave of Absence



Attendance

- If member cannot make in-person or Zoom meeting, they can attend another club or in-person at these Clubs:

Bozeman Noon – Manhattan – Big Sky

When traveling, you can make-up in another city/country. Visit [Rotary.org](https://www.rotary.org) and use, "club locator"



Red to Blue Badge – try to complete in 90-120 days

1. Attend a new member orientation with mentor or proposer
2. Tell us about yourself at scheduled club meeting
3. Attend a Board of Directors meeting
4. Participate in a club service project
5. Expand Rotary by Inviting a guest or proposing a new member
6. Wear the red badge a minimum of three months.
7. Select and join one of the Sunrise Rotary Club Committees
8. Serve as a greeter at club meeting



Dues are \$175/Q++

* ++ = cost of meals that you agree to pay for. When inviting guests to Friday meeting and they take food, it is expected that the member cover the cost of the guest's meal as a courtesy to them. Other meals or socials with a fee can be added to your quarterly bill.



Avenues of Service within the club

Community – meets monthly and oversees:

Weekly Meals on Wheels – Tuesday Lunch (2 members, driver & nav)

Glen Lake Rotary Park (GLRP) – aka Bozeman Beach (we est'd in 1992 – thru 2025, committed \$800k+

Kids Fishing Day – 3rd Saturday of May at GLRP, Free to everyone

Fix-Up Festival – rehabilitate multiple homes – September or October (pending)



Avenues of Service

Vocational / Educational – meet monthly

Homeless Student service – Financially support students with support for necessary expenses thru high school stewardship programs

Spring Book Giveaway – we deliver and giveaway books to all 2nd graders in Gallatin County to promote literacy. We volunteer 60-90 mins at one of 20+ schools (March, April and May)

Provide scholarships to area HS students to continue training and education in their future fields



Avenues of Service

Public Relations – 1st Tuesday monthly

Intra-Club member communications (website and weekly bulletin) and social channels Facebook and Instagram

Educate the community through publishing online, print, and broadcast content through our media partners

Help club members tap Rotary's branding tools to widen their footprint

Help committees coordinate communications with sponsors and donors to improve their service efforts



Avenues of Service

International – meets periodically

Provide micro-grants for local (Montana-based) service initiatives we seek from local sources

Seek international partners to work on Rotary's 5 areas of service (water & sanitation, literacy & education, promoting peace, saving mothers & children, growing local economies and fighting disease)

Have opportunity to oversee International grant project on our behalf in another country. Currently in Nepal and Kenya

Securing Speakers

- Weekly programs are the bedrock of member engagement
- Suggest a speaker/topic to Pres-Elect within 12 months
- Seek people you would like to hear from. Can be in person or via Zoom
- No soliciting for money or help from non-profits
- For-Profits not to pitch for business - inform about your industry and market dynamics
- We provide a PC laptop for presenting



Recruiting new Members

- No classification can be more than 10% of total membership (example: banking)
- Qualifications – a proposed member should demonstrate good character, integrity, and leadership; possess good reputation within their business, profession, and/or community; and are willing to serve in their community and/or around the world. Or, are Rotary alumnus*
- Here is the process to propose a new member....

- Submit candidate proposal form to membership chair (We request that they have lived and worked here at least one-year prior to being proposed)
- Committee reviews, and approves or denies
- Board reviews, and approves or denies
- Candidate is read 2x to general membership
- 7 days after 2nd reading, proposer is notified
- If approved, invite them to meeting or event as your guest
- If wish to join, give member on-boarding form and explain requirements to them in person if possible



Proposer's Role

- Your responsibility as a new member proposer:
 - Attend induction ceremony
 - Attend orientation training
 - Assist member through their Red to Blue process
 - Stay in touch – be aware of their attendance
 - Be their mentor for at least 1st year
