	<p>Sunrise Foundation</p>	<p>General foundation or designated to specific project Gen Fdn Current balance: \$82,000 BPFK Current balance: tallying up</p>
		<p>Honduras: over \$30,000 raised in 2012-13 to support global project</p>
		<p>Backpacks for Kids: over \$20,000 annually</p>
		<p>Miscellaneous projects, such as: \$500 for Busco Mi Destino (joint with Noon Rotary Club) leveraged > \$2,000 \$700 for Wheels of Hope \$1,500 for STEP students – gas cards \$300 for Adopt-A-Stream \$500 for STEP program at TC High</p>
		<p>\$2,000 annual scholarship fund for outbound exchange students in our District</p>

	Rotary Charities	~\$1.2 to 1.5 million/year (4.5% over the past 5 years)
	Rotary Fund at GT Regional Community Foundation	Up to \$250/yr/Rotarian to support contributions to NPOs, global projects of club or through a local NPO
	\$3,000/yr/club to 8 regional Rotary Clubs to support club projects	To match Rotarian gifts to local NPOs/global projects, to date in 2013: Only 12 people have taken advantage of program (~\$3,000) If everyone did, we would double the giving potential to \$16,250!
		To match Club projects, such as: \$3,000 to support Honduras (2012) \$3,000 to support outdoor play area at Discovery Center (2013)

Sustaining Member (Every Rotarian Every Year)	\$100 per year to the “Annual Fund” (a.k.a. “SHARE”)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> •Clubs and Districts . . . and the world •50% of Rotarian donations are returned to their Districts and made available for Matching Grants •The remaining 50% are used to fund other TRF programs
Paul Harris Fellow	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> •Recognizes each \$1,000 increment •Eligible contributions are to Annual Fund, PolioPlus or an approved Foundation Grant 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> •PolioPlus beneficiaries •Clubs/Districts for donations to Annual Fund •Specific cause for donations to approved Foundation Grant




Bequest Society (a.k.a. Benefactor)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • \$10,000 or more via estate plan • <u>Contributions are to the Permanent Fund</u> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • TRF • Principal is never spent • Earnings are used to cover administrative fees and are directed to other programs based on need

Rotary 	Global Grant	Project is \$30k +	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> •Funds a project in another country •Requires support of club local to the project •Matched by TRF (0.5 : 1 for club funds, 1:1 for District funds) •Club must have 2 members attend Grant Training Seminar (annually)
Rotary 	Packaged Grant	Varies	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> •Specific projects are identified by TRF (currently nursing, water & sanitation, health education, medical vocational training) •Info at website
