

Last Week's Program Tribe's Casino Path Like a Coaster Ride by Peggy Maniates

Olntroducer **Dave Alexander** described the Little River Band of Ottawa Indians' road to a new casino in Fruitport as a twenty-year roller coaster ride as he presented three members of the Tribal Council including Larry Romanelli, Ogema (CEO); Virgil Johnson, Tribal Council Speaker; and Frankie Medacco.

Messers Romanelli and Johnson spoke briefly on the long road to get to this point. They were happy to announce that the tribe, after receiving a Section 9 waiver from Governor Snyder which would allow the casino proposal to move on for federal government consideration, published a Notice of Intent to undertake an environmental review to place the land in trust for gaming purposes for the tribe on September 2015. They will be holding a Public Hearing on Thursday, October 15, 2015, 6:00pm, at the Fruitport Middle School Auditorium, 3113 E. Pontaluna Road. They consider a strong community

presence at that meeting very important.

Mr Johnson informed Rotarians about the tribes' activities in Muskegon: there are 600 members living in the Muskegon area, 4,200 members altogether, and the tribe helps those members with education and social services. Casino revenue will help provide better opportunities for them as well as local citizens. The proposed casino will bring more than 1,200 new jobs to Muskegon County. The Little River Band of Ottawa Indians would be making a \$180 million dollar investment to build the casino. This would include 1,700 slot machines, 35 table games, a 220-room hotel as well as opportunities for local entrepreneurs, established retail outlets and chain restaurants.
