Last Week's Program

What's 70 x 7? by Kathy Moore

This is not a math problem, but a community solution that empowers citizens returning to Muskegon County from prison or jail to navigate through life's roadblocks and help ensure their future success.

70 times 7 Life Recovery -Muskegon is a local, non-profit organization that provides relational support in the areas of addition



recovery, life skills development and transitional employment. Their mission is to restore dignity, purpose and hope

through mentorship, employment, job skills training, and recovery support to ex-offenders and

individuals struggling with addiction.

Rotarian **Erin Kuhn**, above, introduced her husband



and Board Chair Chris Kuhn, Executive Director Joe Whalen, above, Staffing Director Andrew Mann, and Program Manager Scott Brown.

Scott Brown shared some personal successes and situational experiences that prepared him for his role in mentoring ex-offenders, coaching them through positive

community re-entry, and promoting the agency's mission. After his story, Mr Brown, right, enlightened us with local statistics



regarding overdoses in Muskegon County to help bring home his point that "untreated addiction is killing our children."

Andrew Mann, below, continued the presentation with information about the Jobs for Life training. "It's a program, not just a staffing service.", Mann explained, "We partner with employers to create



opportunities for long-term success." Participants are able to navigate through many employment barriers via this structured,

transitional program that encompasses training, job connections and a continuous support network.

The organization is fairly new to Muskegon County. It was developed in partnership with the anchor organization, 70 x 7 Life Recovery of Holland, as the first replication of this Michigan >>>

>>> program with a proven participant recidivism rate. The name 70 times 7 was inspired from Scripture (Matthew 18:21-22). Many thought-provoking questions ensued, prompting **President Josh** to comment that the membership was obviously very engaged.
