  - i. 4 units of commercial/residential space

  - iii. MCC downtown center
  - iv. Burkshire (84 units senior housing)
  - v. Dog park
- c. Where Muskegon is headed was also mentioned. There are 6 stories next to Unruly that are being developed. A grocery store/market space is in the works, as well as additional commercial spaces sprinkled throughout downtown.
- d. Challenges to downtown include marketing, future funding, and connecting downtown to the lakefront.
