EL SALVADOR

Rotary International District 6290 sponsored a group of teens and adults to build houses in El Salvador. With funds raised and the group's fantastic work ethic, they were able to build six houses in a week in Talnique, El Salvador despite the 90-degree humid weather! Michelle Burley, one of the chaperones and leaders of the group, led the presentation with a slideshow which you can see too—CLICK HERE.

All four Interactors mentioned today how tough the work was (dropping placas and mortaring) but the fun (going to the beaches), new experiences (climbing a volcano), and empathy and insights gained proved to be invaluable and recommend the trip for anyone who may be interested.

There were three other students who were not able to attend the meeting today—Addie Witmer, Landon, and Emerson Foreman.

Members of the Muskegon Rotary joined a couple Grand Haven Rotarians and partnered with a Honduran organization called Chispa to build a library in an elementary school on the outskirts of Tegucigalpa, the capital of Honduras. The school, Jose Angel Ulloa, serves 349 students, K-6th grade. The school applied for a Chispa Library about a year ago (there is currently a waitlist of over 500 schools!) and has been preparing diligently for the library installation for several months. Our Rotarians and students worked alongside teachers, students, administration, and community leaders to paint murals on the library and classroom walls, build bookshelves, inventory 750 new books, and assist with classroom activities. There was a ribbon cutting ceremony to officially inaugurate the library at the end of the week. Marcia spoke about the impacts our politics have even on the Honduran community they were at.

Elias enjoyed his time helping and having fun playing soccer and basketball with the local kids. He was humbled by his experience in seeing what we take for granted, they appreciated. He gave the example of bread is just bread to us; however, to them, it is appreciated at the level of cake as a special occasion item.

All appreciated their experience and would recommend it to anyone considering for next year.
