

A week ago Tuesday, the state's environmental agency EGLE had an online webinar on the Windward Pointe/Sappi site's issue of methane contamination on the huge former paper mill on Muskegon Lake. The presentation was excellent on the history, science, mitigation and future development of Windward Pointe. There were several media reports on the event. some better than others.
