

Last Week's Program **Total Trek Quest** by Lisa Hegenbart

TTQ is a 9-week experiential learning program in both the fall and spring seasons for boys in grades 3-5. TTQ encourages them to explore and develop their individuality and strengths. The goal of the TTQ program is to increase boys' health and wellness while preventing high risk behaviors through physical activity and training. Local volunteers from varying backgrounds and ages 18-68 coach a group of 5-7 boys. The season consists of 18 practice sessions which last 90 minutes immediately following school dismissal (teams practice at participating schools).

At the end of the 9-week program, the boys run a 5K. The program has been in Ottawa County for 11 years with almost 4000 boys served and last year began in Muskegon County at Churchill Elementary. In the fall, TTQ runs their own 5K and in the spring their current partner is the Tulip Time 5K with hopes of expanded partnerships in the spring with the Seaway Run.

Whv QTT bib decide to start with 3rd- 5th grade? you ask. Because through local vouth assessment, surveys found that in



Ottawa and Muskegon Counties, there is an early onset of substance abuse with tobacco and alcohol as well as children describing themselves as obese or overweight. Through the program, the boys can build self-esteem and learn to make healthy choices.


