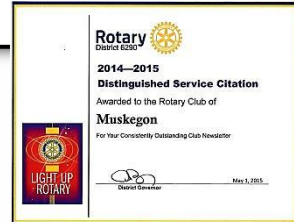

Love INC has been in business for over 35 years starting in Holland. Today there are over 140 affiliates in 30 states consisting of a network of more than 9,000 churches. One million needs are met each year with a total of 300,000 volunteers. Love INC uses a proven model that networks local churches,

Love INC is not a franchise and in order to start a Love Inc, a minimum of six churches must come together for the greater good of the community. A broad spectrum of people benefit from Love INC, referred by the Church or other community agencies.

This reporter has volunteered in prior years to talk about budgeting as a part of the financial management class and it is very rewarding to know that you are giving people the skills they need to help them improve themselves.
