First of all – make a note – we're meeting at the <u>Holiday Inn this week only</u>. On August 3, the Muskegon Area District Library will ask voters in its district to renew and increase its current tax rate by half a mill, from 0.749 mills to 1.249 mills, for 10 years through 2026. The owner of a \$100,000 house with a \$50,000 taxable value would pay \$64.50 a year instead of \$37.45 under the current rate.

Noah's Project

Initially formed by the late benefactress Peggy White Knight, Noah's Project was once the only "no kill" animal shelter in Muskegon: it's located on Airline Rd. Now all Muskegon shelters in the county are no kill! Noah's goal is for "No more homeless pets." Every dog and cat accepted is treated with love and dignity, and every effort is made to find adoptive homes. If for any reason a home cannot be found, pets will live safe, happy lives at the shelter cared for by caring volunteers and staff. No animal is euthanized.

On average, Noah's Project has 40 cats and 20 dogs at a time. Year-to-date, they have >>>

>>> homed 150 behind last year's 358 (which was 30% over the previous year) due to renovations. They have seven employees and 60-80 volunteers. Each dog and cat is neutered or spayed prior to adoption. To adopt a dog or cat, you must be at least 18, have permission from your landlord if applicable, complete an adoption application, an adoption interview and pay an adoption fee of \$175. Every Friday night is BINGO held at Select Auditorium on Laketon to help raise funds for the Project. In addition there are two upcoming fundraisers: This Saturday, July 16 is "Party for Paws Golf Event" at Fruitport Golf Club and it is \$55/person.
