Last Week's Program The Story of the Muskegon Area District Library by Lisa Hegenbart

presented by **Kelly Richards**, executive director; Allison Keessen, storyteller; Richard Schneider, director of operations; and Brenda Hall, director of finance.

After some stage-setting by introducer **Bob Chapla** and **Kelly Richards**, Allison, below, kicked off the presentation with a rousing *cheer* as is used to start Storytime at the library. She shared the importance of engaging and interactive early literacy programs. Founded in 1938 as the Muskegon County Library, the Muskegon Area District Library (MADL) formed in 2006 as the result of a millage campaign. MADL serves 21 governmental units throughout Muskegon County.



27,000 miles annually to deliver books to all ten branches. The library is a community anchor for educational programs.

Based on a Strategic Planning Survey



completed by the library, Richard Schneider, bottom of page, presented the focus of services provided: Early Childhood Literacy, Library for the Blind and Physically Handicapped, and Lifelong Learning. Libraries must get more sophisticated working with children. Services and programs of MADL are designed to enrich the lives of those in Muskegon County. They encourage everyone to visit the library frequently to find books, programs, and activities for kids, teens, and adults. Their collection contains approximately 270,000 items, including books for all ages as well as large print books, audio books, CDs, and DVDs.

On Tuesday, August 2, Muskegon County residents will vote on an operating millage renewal

and increase for the library. The proposed 1.249 millage proposal will renew the current 0.749 mills with an additional 0.5 mills and provide funding for a period of 10 years through 2026. The existing millage provides funding through December 31, 2016. Finance Director Brenda Hall, right, shared that the Muskegon Area District Library will cease to operate without voter approval of a millage. Rotary members stated that the library is necessary for the long-term viability of our community. Yard signs in support of the millage are available from the library.

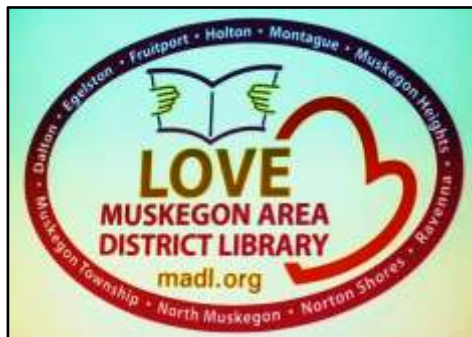
NEWS / ANNOUNCEMENTS – COMMITTEE MEMBERS, GUESTS
