True Story by Bill Johanson My Time with Richard M Nixon

One of our talented RIM reporters, **David Manley**, had a great idea recently. "How about an occasional article featuring one of our Rotarians," he said, "helping us to know each other better?" Forget picky "how to get started "details; I'll just make space available (half a column?) to anyone with a brief story about themselves or another member. As an example, I'll go first:

In October 1965, former Vice President of the United States under President Eisenhower, Richard M Nixon came to Indiana University,



Bloomington to speak to a student body still largely supportive of the Vietnam War. Earlier that evening, he conducted a news conference in the IU Radio & Television

Building and I, for a photo class, was assigned

to take pictures of the occurrence. I used a borrowed press camera of the day, one usually shot from a person's belt buckle area so looking down to see the viewfinder was absolutely imperative.

During a break in the action - with Mr Nixon all alone, only about six feet away, but me too shy to approach him - I stared down at the viewfinder and quickly snapped a photo of him looking at me face-level (photo's above). Our emotional connection may have been for only an instant, if not a second or two; in any event,



I did spend "time" with the man who, four years later, had become US president and my commanderin-chief in Vietnam. He traveled once to the Big Red One's ultrasafe DiAn Base Camp. Who knows

what could've happened had he but seen and recognized me there in the middle of my updated shyless snappy soldier salute.
