



Last Week's Program A World Community Service Project- WEHOP



Don Crandall, past president of Muskegon Rotary 2013-2014, took the time to walk us through the efforts and progress of

bringing clean water to Honduras over the last 10 years.

Honduras became a focal point for the group in 1998 when the category 5 hurricane "Mitch" pummeled through the region killing thousands and leaving 2.7 million homeless.

International Aid was provided for 10 years until 2008 when a locally formed 501(c)3 non profit called the Health & Humanitarian Outreach Project (HHOP). Rotary took over the operations in Honduras.

This group was established in 1996 by the Rotary Clubs of Grand Haven, Holland, Muskegon & Spring Lake dedicated to helping support, promote, and help operate international health and humanitarian projects.

During the last nine years of taking this leadership role in the Honduras, HHOP has installed over 10,000 bio-sand water filters, built vented stoves and latrines in the remote villages of the region. While also establishing a distribution center for bio-sand filters, sand, educational materials, and installation services.

Working with International Rotary Clubs has been essential in executing these projects. Such as the **Usula Rotary Club District 4250 in Honduras**, which helped to secure 2 Rotary International grants which bought clean water and

sanitation to over 950 families in the El Merendon region. **The Morendon Rotary Club**, while working with Don's wife (Nancy Crandall) they were able to obtain reading books, work books, flash cards and school uniforms for the students in the region.

The **Santa Rosa de Copan Rotary Club**, which has been essential to bringing water systems to remote villages and hospital water systems, along with **The Rotary Club of Comayagua** which has helped to deliver water filters, latrines, and computer education in the El Ayudante region.

On a national and local level, Rotary Clubs of Florida and San Diego, many clubs in the 6290 District and many other NGO's and non profits have been supportive all the way through these last nine years of efforts, which has successfully installed over 1800 filters.

In 2017, 20 people visited El Ayudante, which has 12 different communities in a 25 square mile area in Comayagua Honduras. 11 of those 20 individuals were Rotaract and Interact students from our West Michigan area.

While there, they installed 60 new filters, serviced 51 existing filters installed in recent years, built 3 latrines and spent 2 days laying a cement floor in a much needed adobe home.

The seriousness of this work can be a matter of life or death since the water that the locals in the region have access to is contaminated with E Coli and other disease bearing bacterias. This same water can be ran through the filters that we install, essentially making the water pure and contaminate free ready for use.

Don spent a moment to share about the recent merger between HHOP and another local non profit 501(c)3 which carries a similar vision to serve the under privileged called Thirsting to Serve (T2S).

This merger has been in the works since 2013 but has now come together under the new name (WEHOP) Water and Environmental Humanitarian Outreach Program. This venture is sure to be a success and we look forward to new ways and opportunities to serve the Honduras region and beyond.
