

Jerry Wiersma is more than just a funny guy! He is the owner of two local businesses: West Michigan Power Cleaning Equipment and West Michigan Small Engine Repair. Wiersma presented a "power"ful program using nothing but "clean" language.

Witham hired Wiersma as the company salesman and, a few years later, sold the business to Wiersma and his dad, the late Jerry, Sr. The business specializes in power cleaning solutions for commercial, industrial, agriculture and residential customers. They sell new, used, reconditioned and refurbished power cleaning equipment and supplies, and have a full service facility with certified technicians.

Their main line of cleaning equipment is Karcher, which is the largest manufacturer of cleaning equipment in the world. Karcher holds 1,600 patents; ships out over 10,000 machines a day; and captures 87% of the worldwide market. Headquartered in Winnenden. Germany, Karcher's brand is so

dominant that the name "Karcher" has become a verb meaning "to clean". West Michigan Power Cleaning Equipment is recognized as a "Preferred Karcher dealer" for its outstanding customer sales. service and support.

Also impressive is the range of niche machines they provide such as escalator cleaners, dry ice blasting equipment, battery operated window washers, and 93% efficient hot water >>>



Jerry briefly touched upon his second business. West Michigan Small Engine Repair, which he started in 2004

after he couldn't find anyone to fix his lawn mower. "It's been growing ever since," he stated. This company will help clean, repair or replace lawn mowers, snow blowers, chain saws, and more. They also offer pick-up and delivery service.

So, what does Jerry Wiersma do for fun? He restores muscle cars... mostly special edition or rare models. Wiersma and a long-time buddy meticulously clean, restore and/or replace every part of the vehicles they restore; this may involve removing, sandblasting, painting, replacing or recreating unique pieces. Not sure that counts as "fun", but Wiersma's sense of humor was sprinkled throughout his presentation. And although he is involved in some serious businesses, Jerry Wiersma is still a funny guy.
