When We All Went to War

This is a presentation by Donald Goodman, researcher and author of a book about students who attended Muskegon Junior College and went off to war in 1942. Don Goodman and his recently departed colleague Jack Rice, wrote a history of Muskegon Junior/Community College in 2001 to honor the College's 75th anniversary.

The war years took their toll on young men attending MJC. Don captured their stories and anecdotes as well as other interesting facts about the war as it affected Muskegon. Join us for a walk down memory lane of Muskegon to hear how these young college students fared, or did not, in defense of this country. A book signing will follow for those who wish to purchase the book, a keepsake for Muskegon residents.

Poland: 70 years after the War

A presentation by Frank Marczak who returned from a trip to Poland earlier this year. Traveling with his son Greg, the two visited Poznan, Warsaw and Krakow. During their visit, they met with high school students and residents who are anxious about the current state of affairs with Russia. They also experienced the company of two women who were children in the early '40s. From their perspective, the comment "this era reminds us of 1939" was heard, and it sent a mild chill through the assembled group of family and friends. Frank's presentation, complete with personal photos of human joy and suffering (Auschwitz), will follow Don's presentation.

Don Crandall gave a brief history of our history of Parties in the Park, Inc, that began as collaboration with the Muskegon Jaycees Club and City of Muskegon in 1984. Since that time, Rotary has donated \$97,500 for a variety of projects to benefit Hackley Park. To celebrate the 30th Anniversary of Parties in the Park, our Community Grants Committee has raised nearly \$100,000 to build a permanent stage at the park. The design has been approved by the local Historical Commission and City of Muskegon that will allow this new building to fit in well with its beautiful surroundings. Recent design elements and a perpetual maintenance fund are requiring additional financial support of \$20,000 to \$25,000. 
Don Crandall called for a motion and support to accept the updated Bylaws. Motion carried.
