BOILERS & BRIDGES

With one of two bridges restored in Muskegon County's Veterans Memorial Park, bridge #2 now gets



its turn to look new again. As mentioned in an earlier RIM, the original bridges were wooden. They were updated to steel structures by C Leigh Stevens II and his helpers from the Muskegon Boiler Works. Let's talk about that company for a moment.

The early company changed ownership a couple of times and, by 1885, was making boilers as well as doing repairs. The company consolidated with >>>

>>> Novelty Iron Works and a new building was erected on Western near Seventh.

About that same time, C D
Stevens became a principle owner
of the company. The association of
Stevens and his sons with
Muskegon Boiler Works continued
into the 1950s. Their flexible
management style was cited as the
main reason the company
continued to survive for so many
years.

The Muskegon Boiler Works building, below, located between Eighth and



Ninth Streets and Clay Avenue, was built in 1905.

The Works today

ArtWorks, as it's called, represents a transformation of the 140-year old former Muskegon Boiler Works into vibrant arts and cultural apartment homes in the City of Muskegon. The ArtWorks community consists of 26 spacious two-bedroom apartment homes near downtown Muskegon. ArtWorks of Muskegon features over 3000 square feet of



community space to be used for the creation, demonstration, exhibition and performance of works of art produced by its residents.



MAISD is the #1 provider for early childhood services from birth through preschool They

provide professional development for educators, play a major role in supporting a countywide fiber network built with county government and central dispatch 911, and the primary college connection with the Promise. Early College, Muskegon Opportunity & Career Tech Center.

The MAISD serves Muskegon county from the 2nd poorest in the state to the 40th wealthiest school district. 34% of the children under age 5 live in poverty, 58% of students are eligible for free/reduced lunch and over 26% of the kids miss 10_ days of school each year.



They support Muskegon Heights through a renewed partnership agreement with MI Dept of Ed, have adopted blueprint

school implement model, have a new superintendent-Rane Garcia, provided more competitive employment, better training and coaching, and started the process to get a playground for MLK. MAISD is about Savings Lives through transition to a WHOLE child approach to education.

They provide suicide prevention and mental health training and have since partnered with Health West and Law Enforcement to further their impact.

What can you do? Read to a child, serve as a mentor to a teen, donate to Read early. Read often to buy new books, donate new or used children's books and continue to support the local schools. And you can follow educational legislation and advocate for children

President Cathy shared the World Roundup, Rotary projects around the globe from the Rotarian September 17, 2017. In Nigeria more than 90% of people in the village of Itamarun

are poor. The Lagos club's president was approached by the director of a health clinic to help improve conditions. The club initially provided villagers with a \$3000 palm kernel cracking machine. Improving cracking of 100 kilograms by 4 people over two weeks to only two hours. Earlier this year, club members provided another \$9,500 system that pumps treated water and installed \$12,600 worth of solar street lights. See page 14 to read about projects in other countries.


