Heart disease and stroke remain the number one cause of death in America; Courtney Failer began her presentation, affecting 1 in 3 lives. The American Heart Association seeks to changes those numbers and save lives with a network of more



than 22.5 million volunteers and supporters. The AHA funds innovative research, fights for stronger public health policies, and provides critical tools

and information to save and improve lives.

Courtney shared with us some of the accomplishments of the American Heart Association. The advocacy team has fought for

legislation, including smoke-free spaces and congenital heart defect screening for newborns. The organization is the nation's leader in CPR training, and Courtney informed us that "hands only" CPR has saved many lives, as more bystanders are willing to attempt this form of lifesaving. Just remember: strong compressions to the middle of the chest to the beat of "Staying Alive!"

The funding raised by the American Heart Association has also advanced lifesaving medical treatments and technologies including the "artificial heart," cholesterol lower medication, groundbreaking surgical procedures and more. The AHA is aggressively pursuing research to end heart disease.

The American Heart Association visited us last week to remind us to "Go Red for Women!" Heart disease and stroke were once thought to primarily affect men. However, said Courtney, director-AHA's Go Red for Women in Grand Rapids, they are the number one and number 5 killers of women. Go Red for Women is the world's largest network standing together to end heart disease and stroke and protect women's health. They provide important education as well

as funding for research. We learned a valuable piece of information during the presentation. Women's symptoms of a heart attack may differ from those of men. Uncomfortable fullness in the chest, pain in the arms, back or neck, shortness of breath, or the common chest pain are all symptoms of a heart attack.

Go Red for Women will have its second annual event in Muskegon on Thursday, October 20. It will be held at Verdonis Event Center from 5:30-8:00pm. The night will include pampering, a silent auction, hors d'ourves, a cash bar and a Go Red Presentation. Please reserve your tickets at this link:
