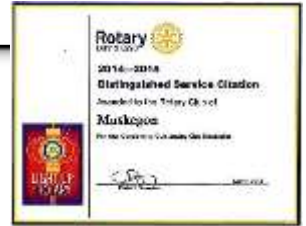

Affinia Health Care (incorporated in 1994 serving Muskegon, North Ottawa, Oceana and Mason Counties) is wholly owned by Mercy Health. It is a membership organization in which providers and

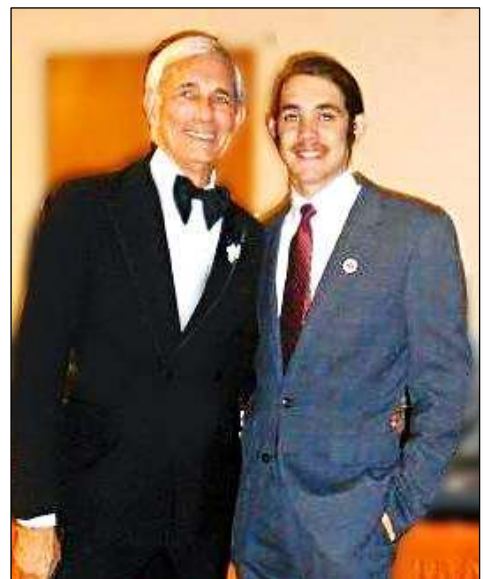
hospitals are the members..

Current membership consists of 520 physicians, advanced practice providers, three hospitals, and ancillary providers. All are working together to improve outcomes of the population's health by managing accountability and delivery of health care services to the community. This will include complete and timely information about patients and the services they are receiving, technology and skills for population management and coordination of care.

With resources, a teamwork culture, and coordinated relationships with specialists and other providers, the quality of health care will someday be defined. Jen recommends reading the TIME Magazine article that came out a couple of years ago, "BITTER PILL" stating that Health Care since WWII is not sustainable.

President Susan Crain—New Member Get Together—February 18, 2016, meeting place TBD.

Don Crandall—Grants Committee is involved with three new global grants from Rotary International totaling \$120,450 for: 1) Global Scholarship, 2) Silage Project for Dairy Farmers in Kenya, and 3) Agricultural Impendence in South Africa. There were 28 separate District grants totaling \$686,067 The District designated funds (DDF) were \$69,082 of which our fund covered \$67,000 and an additional \$2,082 came from the District. There were six Education & Literacy projects primarily in the US, but also in Costa Rica; and four Wellness projects in the US, Peru, Canada & Ghana. Medical supplies and health support along the Amazon River in Peru was sponsored through MSU Medical Mission; Six Water projects in the Dominican Republic & Honduras (water filters at both Ayudante and Comayugua); Four Foods & Agriculture mostly through local grants to US, Africa; and Eight Community Development projects in US and Nepal to include Rotary Parks in at least three communities. In Nepal, training is being provided to over 100 carpenters and masons for vocational support programs to help rebuild homes in the earthquake stricken areas of Nepal.
