Rotary International Ukraine Refugee Aid

"Sadly, the Ukrainian war continues but as Rotarians, we can make a difference," Past President Mark Meyers on behalf of the World



Community Service Committee announced at our April 14th meeting. Three weeks ago, he asked for members to consider giving to the Rotary Disaster Response Fund. At that time, Rotary had around \$1.2 Million and as of Thursday, they have \$8.8 Million in donations. Of that, Rotary has made 43 disaster response grants already. April 30th is the deadline for donations to go toward Ukrainian refugees (this donation will count toward Every Rotarian Every Year too).

John Slocum, the Interact Advisor at North Muskegon High School, had conversations with the students about



what they had seen regarding the Ukrainian war and found they were experiencing frustration and asking how can they help. Even though the students are working on five-six other global projects, they were flexible and saw this need. John and **John Noling** spoke about a challenge for the local Interact Clubs. Once this challenge from our club spread, an Interactor of six years, Trevor from North Muskegon, took on this challenge and

was able to bring \$1200 from a very generous donation from Lee's Famous Recipe Chicken!

We only need \$400 more to triple our club's \$1500 pledge for Rotary's Disaster Relief Fund for Ukraine thanks to generous Rotarians, Interactors, and Lee's Famous Recipe Chicken.

Muskegon Rescue Mission



Speakers: Dan Skoglund Introduced By: **Kris Collee** RIM Reporter: **Chip Chipman**



This past week, the Rotary Club of Muskegon had the great pleasure of hosting Dan Skoglund, who is the Executive Director of the Muskegon Rescue Mission. The Muskegon Rescue Mission has been helping our community for over 100 years and Dan gave us a peak at what they have in store for the future to continue to serve our community.



Dan is a native of Muskegon, has raised two daughters with his wife, and is a graduate of Grace College with degrees in Psychology and Business. He has previously worked for the Muskegon Chronicle and was also previously in the insurance industry.

For the last twelve years, Dan has worked for the Muskegon Rescue Mission as the Executive Director. His mission is guided by a commitment to bring "God's help, hope, and healing to individuals struggling with generational poverty."

Dan's focus is strategic leadership and vision, and he oversees all programs and community initiatives.

In that regard, Dan has a big vision for the future of the Muskegon Rescue Mission and its ability to better serve our entire community. Currently, their services are limited to helping individuals, and families only after they are experiencing homelessness. They will soon be expanding their services and actively coordinating with other groups throughout our community to help people before they are forced into homelessness.



The City of Muskegon has graciously gifted the Muskegon Rescue Mission 1.4 acres of property adjacent to the location of their Men's Shelter building. Ground is scheduled to be broken on this property at 1PM on April 25th for their new 16,000 square foot multi-purpose facility.



The new facility will include a preschool, and affordable daycare center. Both of which will enable parents to retain employment as they work to support their family. The center will also have a heating and cooling center to better protect those who are vulnerable to the environment and have no where to go. Not only that, but the expanded kitchen area in the new facility will have free lunches, a weekly food pantry, and will host cooking classes

to help those adjusting to living on their own.



One of the most important factors in breaking the cycle of homelessness is active case management. The reality of the current situation is many offices are providing different services and are spread all around town, making it difficult for those who need the help to easily find and attain it. The new facility will act as a local hub, hosting one-on-one case management with those on the verge of homelessness to set up a roadmap for their own unique situations. Currently, there are 20+ partnering agencies who will be available in the new facility to those in need, including the VA, Read Muskegon, MDHHS, Michigan Works, and Mercy Health.
