This week's program: Journey Through Africa Speaker: Paul Billings Introduced by: Kris Collee Reporter: Kathy Moore



In introducing our program speaker, Kris Collee described Paul Allen Billings as an accomplished leader and entrepreneur. He founded the West Michigan Community Help Network and owns two local FM radio stations (103.7 The Beat and 106FM). Impressively, his dedication to marginalized communities extends beyond our local boundaries into Orlando, Florida – where he launched a community-focused radio station, and Abeadze Kyeakor Village, Ghana – where he serves as Developmental Chief, promoting sustainable growth and positive cultural exchanges. Mr. Billings dedication, leadership, and valuable contributions over the past twenty years have been recognized with numerous honors including the City of Muskegon 2019 Citizen of the Year Award and, most recently, the 2024 Muskegon Lakeshore Chamber of Commerace Entrepreneur of the Year.



Paul Allen Billings first acknowledged and thanked several employees, long-term affiliates, and supporters of his radio station and initiatives. He then explained that his slide presentation is normally about an hour long, so today's program is an abbreviated version. He proceeded to share his journey through Africa and enlightened us with his personal discovery of its culture, beauty, nature, wealth, and leadership. The colorful pictures were fascinating and captured the incredible essence of the continent and the 14 African countries that he visited. Slide by slide – from Ghana to Kenya to Ethiopia, Egypt, Nigeria, Zimbabwe, and many more – Paul shared his experience and emotional connection as he strived to dispel negative conceptions. Ghana has a rich history of transatlantic slave trade sites that attract visitors who are seeking to understand the resilience of its people. Kenya is home to the  $2^{nd}$ largest airline in Africa. Kenya Airlines is black-owned and flies to 42 destinations worldwide. Ethiopia is renowned for its rich history, diverse landscapes, and status as the only African nation never colonized. One of the world's most natural wonders. Victoria Falls, is located on the borders of Zambia and Zimbabwe. This breathtaking cascade of water spans over 1,600 meters and plunges to a depth of over 100 meters. Paul described his visit to Egypt as a life-changing, rich cultural experience and shared breathtaking pictures of the famous pyramids and the legendary Sphinx of Giza.



Kudos to Paul Allen Billings for helping to positively reshape the historical image of Africa through his presentations and personal story of his incredible journey. He informed us that he feels especially connected to this mission because his genetic heritage, confirmed by Ancestry DNA, linked him to 10 of the African countries. In addition, Paul has initiated several projects to help youth and others visit and experience the cultural impact. Kids Free Trip to Africa.
