Making a Difference Spotlight:



This week we heard from long-time White Lake environmental champion Tanya Cabala is the Muskegon County representative of the



West Michigan Environmental Action Council. WMEAC is currently working to assess and improve recycling efforts in Muskegon County. Tanya is a lifelong resident of Muskegon County and lives in Whitehall. She attended Muskegon Community College and Grand Valley State College, graduating with a Bachelor of Science Degree. After teaching first grade for several years, she started a concerned citizen group to focus on cleaning up pollution in her hometown, and in 1991, was hired as Michigan director of the Lake Michigan Federation. She opened an office in downtown Muskegon with a focus on water quality and lakeshore issues, including helping to launch local advisory groups for White Lake and Muskegon Lake that would work for decades with the state and federal government on environmental restoration. White Lake was removed from the hotspot list in 2015 and Muskegon Lake is due in several years. As a self-employed consultant, Tanya assisted numerous local, state, and Great Lakes environmental organizations with research, writing, grant proposals, and education and outreach efforts. THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM: Muskegon County Bicycling Coalition

We learned all about the Muskegon County Bicycling Coalition, a volunteer organization that's been in existence for seven years. Its mission statement aptly describes what they do: To create an inclusive, diverse, and accepting community where people of all ages and backgrounds bicycle for transportation, errands, and for fun and health, and where bicycling brings people and neighborhoods together across Muskegon County."

Ray McLeod, president of the organization, is a retired educator and shared the group traces its roots back to a



weekly bicycle group he helped establish in Whitehall nine years ago, riding from Fetch Brewery. "As a cycler I thought it was safer to ride as a group." That 6 p.m. Thursday Whitehall group is still riding. McLeod then worked with Unruly Brewing in downtown Muskegon to begin a 6 p.m. Tuesday ride.

"We go out for a ride, then refresh ourselves," McLeod said, joking "some people say we're drinkers with a biking habit." These group rides are open to everyone, and Coalition members help organize cyclists based on speed and interest level. "We're doing a lot of good things in the community that we're very proud of," McLeod said. "What we're really trying to do is make our neighborhoods more neighborly."



The group has also helped establish 6:30 p.m. Monday rides leaving from the Muskegon Farmers Market. Other activities include one-day bike rodeos, working with community groups to teach kids safe riding skills, assisting on trail maintenance, and working with local governments to promote and enhance the biking ability across Muskegon County. For example, they have had five local communities – Muskegon, Muskegon Heights, Norton Shores, Roosevelt Park, and Montague – pass a "5-foot rule" to mandate a safe distance between bikes on the road's edge and





Their newest initiative, launching June 1 at the Muskegon Heights District Library, is a "Bike Library," which received a \$2,000 grant from our Club recently. Rotarian and Coalition Treasurer Rob Taylor wrote the grant. Coalition member Chris Mendels thanked Unruly for donating space within their Muskegon Heights brewing facility to store and repair donated bikes for the library. In addition to work in individual communities, Mendels said the coalition is working with the West



Michigan Shoreline Regional Development Commission on the concept of a


"Greenway" of connected bicycle paths around Muskegon County. Funding is being sought to pay for a detailed study.



Aaron Bodbyl-Mast, coalition member and a planner for the Ottawa County Parks and Recreation Commission, has been working on the Urban Greenways

concept for Muskegon County. "The way a lot of our infrastructure is designed, it's more car-centric.... Cars are great but we want to give people

choices. That means creating mobility for all, especially in our urban core," Bodbyl-Mast said.



An "Urban Greenway" is defined as a protected, connected community wide mobility network, including off-street linear parks and on-street protected lanes that links neighborhoods with key destinations according to Aaron. A relatively close example of a successful urban greenway is the Joe Louis Greenway in Detroit, which has attracted \$100 million in public and private funds as a way to improve equity and the overall quality of life through improved mobility.

INDUCTION – Erik Vogas



Erik Vogas was born in Grand Haven and raised in Norton Shores, attending Mona Shores High School. An enthusiastic musician, he was assigned to the snaredrum line in the marching band as an incoming sophomore and was awarded the Louis Armstrong Jazz Award for his work in the Jazz Ensemble.

After graduation, he attended Hope College and though he ultimately did not pursue music as a major at that time, was awarded and maintained the "Distinguished Artist Award" Scholarship to play drums for various school bands until he graduated in 1994.

Destiny struck when he was inspired to spend his junior year as an exchange student in Tokyo, Japan, studying Political Science at highly competitive Waseda University. Through his study there, immersion with his homestay family, and intensive Karate training, he learned to speak Japanese fluently. This was a skill that would strongly influence the trajectory of his career as an international businessperson.

After graduation, he worked in the automotive industry as a technical liaison in Japan for the Quality groups of both Johnson Controls, and then Eagle Ottawa Leather Company, which at that time still had the original tannery in Grand Haven.

It was clear to him that he wanted to leverage creativity more in his profession, and so went back to school to study Industrial Design at the Art Center College of Design in Pasadena, California, where he graduated with honors in 2003.

Professionally Erik has lived over two decades in Japan, wearing various hats as his career evolved. Other than founding and working as a consultant for the Vogas Consulting group since 2011, he has worked as a Senior Designer in Advanced Design for Panasonic, established the business entity and Japan office as the General Manager for Mackevision Media Design headquartered in Stuttgart.

Germany, and most recently worked as the Director of Design, Asia, for the PANGEA leather company, overseeing all Design team efforts in China, Korea, and Japan.
