The Nancy K. Poppen Program

The Nancy K. Poppen Program was established by Sherman and Nancy Poppen in 1993. Nancy was a visual artist who



wanted all children to be able to explore the fine arts. This program is a three-way partnership among the Community Foundation for Muskegon County, The Public Schools of the City of Muskegon, and the Poppen Programs, Inc. Board of Directors.

Program Highlights

- Talented students enrolled at Muskegon Public Schools seeking to develop their art may apply
- Students may apply when they are currently in third through eleventh grade
- No out-of-pocket costs to families
- Offer weekly lessons in the fine arts outside of school, such as private music lessons, visual arts classes, dance classes,



theatre classes, or creative writing and spoken word performance

- Cultural and arts performances available to NKP students
- College campus visits for High School NKP students



Opportunities for summer workshops, pre-college experiences, or arts camp experiences are available to committed students who apply



Sherman R. Poppen Program

In 2000, Sherman and Louise Poppen enhanced the Nancy K. Poppen Program by establishing the Sherman

R. Poppen Scholarship Fund to assist graduating Nancy K. Poppen participants.



Program Highlights

- Open to Muskegon High School seniors as first-time applicants who have been actively involved in the Nancy K. Poppen Program until graduation
- Post-Secondary Scholarship/Apprenticeship/Yo ung Artist Program Opportunities
- Students who intend to major in their arts disciplines in college may apply for financial support
- Graduating seniors, and renewal applications accepted annually by February 1st

 Support for tuition, fees for programs which will further the artistic career of the young artist, room and board needed for post-secondary studies, technology or arts supplies



Poppen Kids

- Average participation 40-60 Big Reds in the Nancy K Poppen program at any time
- About 650 students total in programs' history
- 5-8 Sherman R Poppen scholars supported with funding ranging from \$5500-\$8500 in most years
- Impact over life of the programs has helped many local artists who got their start with Poppen classes: Jubenal Rodriguez, Ashley Nash, Rryuhn Dotson



The Poppen Program can serve more students annually as costs increase, if support continues in the future: Nancy K Poppen Fund *and* Sherman R Poppen Fund *at the* Community Foundation for Muskegon County
