Past President Mark Meyers, on behalf of the World Community Service Committee, spoke about their meeting on March 17, 2022 where they approved a \$1500 donation from the committee's budget toward the Rotary International Ukraine Refugee Aid effort. The committee is challenging our Muskegon Rotary club to raise an additional \$1500. At the WEHOP board last Tuesday, they approved \$1500 donation from their fund after hearing our Muskegon Challenge and are now challenging the other local clubs to match the \$1500 mark. John Noling also informed us that three of our Interact Clubs have set that goal as well and are now challenging the other Interact Clubs as well.

Tim Lipan introduced speakers Pete Gawkowski, Muskegon Clippers Owner, and General Manager



Walt Gawkowski. Pete played ball at Muskegon Community College and Muskegon Catholic Central (first base and pitcher) and has coached youth baseball. Walt is a retired high school



teacher who formerly coached at Muskegon Catholic, North Muskegon and Mona Shores high schools and is the recently-retired Clippers Head Coach.

It's immediately apparent the shared love for this game when you hear the story of Pete and Walt Gawkowski. From their hard work and dedication to building and managing the Muskegon Clippers to how they continue working to restore the rich history of 105-yearold Marsh Field, it is their passion.

Borrowing the name from the 1948-50 Muskegon Clippers, a farm team for White Sox, Tigers, and Yankees, the current Clippers team is a member of the extremely competitive Great Lakes Summer Collegiate League. This league is one of 51 nonprofit national leagues and the Clippers belong to the North Division. Each summer Muskegon families open their homes to host college Clipper players who come from all over the country. With a grueling 42game schedule, these players suit up nearly every night of the week traveling Michigan, Ohio, Indiana, and Ontario. Many of these young players move up to a professional level.

We wouldn't have Clippers baseball if it weren't for the rebuilding of Marsh Field. In 2010, they met with the City of Muskegon to develop a public/private partnership to bring it back to life. The city council unanimously approved their plan-an agreement to manage the ballpark and in return the city would allow them to use it as they pleased. They quickly set out finding ways to generate revenue by putting signage up, running leagues, and charging admission to games. At that time, Muskegon High School and a men's city league were playing there. Slowly, with the help of local businesses and community groups, they began investing in repairs for the stadium. Over \$275,000 has been improved in the stadium including a new scoreboard, new infield surface, expanded dugouts, netting to protect the fans, and the installation of some stadium seating.

This historic Muskegon landmark still hosts the Muskegon Big Reds. There are also eight Friday Night Lights events in a season (was scheduled to start Friday, April 8, but weather has not cooperated), where two high school teams are invited to play. They honor the teams and it serves as a fundraiser for the park. In addition, Marsh Field hosts the GMAA City Tournament Finals; GMAA High School All-Star Game, tournaments, and summer youth clinics where the Clippers players work and have a lot of fun with the kids.

Around 2014, they put together a team for the Michigan Summer Collegiate League. It was a great start, but they had their sights set on bigger and were finally able to join Great Lakes after three years.

With a 105-year-old stadium, the work is never done. Future

improvement needs include a covered grandstand, increased seating capacity, expanded concession area and press box, enlarged dugouts (you can't stand up if you're 5'11"), improvements to the outfield surface, clubhouse facilities and a personal space for visiting teams and umpires, and major restroom upgrades.

Cruising by Marsh Field now, you'll usually see someone out there at any time of the day working. Opening night is June 7, at 7:05 pm. For more information about how you can help, sponsorship opportunities, host a player, or to purchase tickets, visit their website at
