The Innovation Hub (the Hub) is part of Grand Valley State University. The Muskegon SmartZone is in partnership with the City of Muskegon and the State of Michigan. The mission of the Hub is to serve as a business innovation hub that provides guidance, funding, networking, and a synergistic work environment to help businesses and entrepreneurs achieve their goals.

Facility Changes at the Hub

- Converted a classroom into Admin Suites in 2020/21
- More private office space
- Repurposed lightly used spaces
- Added an Artist Studio Space in the Fall of 2022







The Michigan Veteran Entrepreneur (MVE) Lab at the Hub is a free 3month entrepreneurship accelerator for veterans and/or military spouses. It is designed to provide hands-on startup education for those seeking to add \$20,000 or more annual income to their household through small business activity. Program information includes:

- Partnership with Seidman College of Business/Center for Entrepreneurship & Innovation
- First cohort in Muskegon
- Jerry Conrad is the Lead Facilitator
- CO. STARTERS Curriculum
- 13-Week program that culminates in pitch competition
- Starting March 1st
- Wednesday evenings from 6:00pm to 9:00pm (dinner included)
- Open to Michigan veterans, their spouses, and their children (up to age 26)
- Free
- Registration is open on the HUB Website

The Business Accelerator Fund (BAF) is a grant fund to assist early-stage tech-focused entrepreneurs with specific services needed to grow their Muskegon Rotary in Motion Newsletter – Page 3

business. Its milestone based, required to apply through a SmartZone Innovation Center (the Hub), engagements are capped at \$50,000.00 (usually achieved through multiple engagements), and most of the engagements are in the \$10k-\$15k range. The services covered are legal work, marketing, consulting services, productive development, and more. The Hub has awarded over \$200,000.00 in grant funds to eligible businesses through the BAF program. The Hub is looking for more referrals from the community – Help spread the word.
