Chuck Canestraight, President and Manager of parent company Sand Products and its subsidiary Port City Marine, shared a wealth of information today with Rotarians and guests.




He discussed the partnership between the West Michigan Port Operators: Verplank Dock Co,

We Remember Past Rotary President Nathan McClure 1944-2025



Nate served as president for his local Rotary clubs and was outspoken in their mission to eradicate polio. Nate's father was a polio survivor, making Rotary's mission to end polio worldwide a personal one. Nate, along with his father, his wife, and his three daughters, were all Paul Harris Fellows.

Nate was passionate about his role in public service, specifically with the Association of Public Communications Officers (APCO). His involvement with APCO spanned over 60 years where he served as State President (IL) and National President as well as held many committee positions. He attended over 50 national conferences.
