
With her trademark wit, **President Ginny** lets the club know "it's just me" as she introduces herself as this week's speaker.

"People with goals succeed because they know where they're going." – Earl Nightingale Our 2023-2024 Muskegon Rotary President **Ginny Sprague** had a successful vision for our club this year that led us to new heights. Ginny presented her initial July 2023 goals for Members & Engagement, Youth Services, Community Outreach, Service Projects, and the Rotary Foundation Giving and delivered the great news of our accomplishments over these last 11 months.

Since last July, Muskegon Rotary has added ten new members (with two more waiting to be inducted), added new leadership for our Rotaract Clubs at MCC and Baker, added two new Interact Clubs (total of seven now with Mona Shores Middle School and Oakridge High School), added new leadership for Lincoln Park Elementary Early Act and a new club at North Muskegon Elementary, increased the number of students participating in the Life Leadership Conference to 26 (largest number yet for this program that began with our club), continued International service trips to Honduras and El Salvador, continued our Rotary Youth Exchange, and increased community outreach. The Marquette Neighborhood Micro Forest, Muskegon Rising Podcasts, the Family Night Community Mixer, \$15,000 in community grants, \$1,700 for two food trucks, "This is What I Do" interviews, and our increased use of social media through Facebook and YouTube helped increase the community's knowledge of our club. Muskegon Rotary also participated in the United Way Day of Caring preparing the Marquette Neighborhood Micro Forest for our later planting seedlings, trees, and shrubs. Additionally, our club helped pay and distribute food with the March and April food trucks.



The Rotary Foundation was top of mind for President Ginny this year and awareness has been raised successfully with the monthly themes, weekly videos and slides, and through our Program Committee coordinating at least one theme-related weekly program. Through this increased awareness, donations have increased for both the Polio Plus Program and Annual Fund. Nine Paul Harris Fellow awards and five Paul Harris Fellow Plus awards were also presented this year. Ginny explained that Rotary International is hierarchical and the Rotary Foundation is the philanthropic arm of Rotary International and exists to further the work of the organization. As Paul Harris said, "We are here to serve." Ginny continued, "Our district is our connection to the other levels" and we have our own Brianna Scott to help continue that connection as she becomes our District Governor soon.



What was President Ginny's greatest reward from serving this past year? Her greatest joy was getting to know others in our club with a deeper connection and understanding. She revealed, "I broadened my knowledge of everyone in this club and all the good work you do because of my honor of serving in this position." Ginny also said, "Thank you to all of you. None of this would happen without your support, care, and your commitment to Rotary's Service Above Self."
