Ginny offered a special shout out to Mike Vogas and Kim Boersema for their extraordinary commitment and service. A few excerpts from Ginny's closing statements: "We've had a great year working together, embodying service above self...I knew that I was carrying on a tradition of service and leadership forged by 107 of my predecessors...I am humbled by the trust you placed in me...words cannot adequately express how grateful and honored I am to have served as your president this year."
