THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM: Muskegon's Manager Update

MUSKEGON

LeighAnn Mikesell introduced our new City Manager for Muskegon, Jonathan Seyferth. Jonathan noted two

primary areas of focus: 1. Streamline the budget process and 2. Community Engagement via the Connect Muskegon hub.



Jonathan noted that he is working closely with the city council and county commissioners. The City of Muskegon fiscal year starts on July 1, 2023, and will be holding commission meetings in the month of May and June. Budget priorities are based on the commission's mission and vision for the City of Muskegon. A high priority of the city commissioners and Jonathon is community engagement.

The Connect Muskegon is a hub via both a website and Facebook and is designed for community members to engage with the community.



They are using Connect Muskegon on a variety of topics, such as short-term rentals, housing shortages. They are finding great response from the community on these topics and feedback surveys. They can quickly aggregate data and how user friendly the surveys are and to gather commentary feedback.

They are also wrapping up their master plan data. This planning process began well before COVID 19 and met with five communities within the city and how



they can collaborate. This was intentional to gather feedback from local communities and to provide input on areas that they are concerned about, not just the vision of the commissioners. Planning documents are reviewed every five to ten years. The commissioners are also appointing a group of individuals to receive ARPA funding as the city has approximately \$1.6 million in funding to appropriate to the community. This funding is to support the great work that nonprofits, neighborhood associations and businesses. This committee does not include any city commissioners and will be comprised of citizens from local neighborhood associations, Jonathon and some input from United Way and the Community Foundation of Muskegon County.



Parks and recreation component of the city of Muskegon has been resurrected to support the community. They are partnering with local organizations already providing programming in Muskegon's 37 parks located within the city. for Parks and Recreation for the City, a position we have not had for nearly 20 years.

Jonathan also addressed the housing needs of the city of Muskegon. There is master plan located on the website. They looked at 7 neighborhoods in the community and determined that we are 3,000 houses short in our community, both for purchase and for sale and across income demographics. Jonathan noted that they are asking that 80% are meeting community household poverty minimums and accept housing vouchers. For established homes, they continue to provide funding for rehabilitation projects. They are continuing the housing infill project to assist in meeting the needs of city residents. Bowen National Research has conducted research in Ottawa and Kent counties. We are observing an influx of residents from Kent and Ottawa due to lower housing costs, affordable economic development and all the benefits of lakeshore living.

Jonathan noted that they are closely monitoring continued public access along the lakeshore regarding the many developments that are springing up around Muskegon Lake and Lake Michigan. He noted that the City of Muskegon has a strong desire to maintain public access to outdoor recreation. He noted that the entirety of Lake Michigan (within the city limits of Muskegon) is owned by the city and is open to the public year-round. Jonathon also noted that they are always collaborating with other local municipalities in Muskegon County to improve the lives of the citizens here in Muskegon, as well as the local parks and areas where citizens frequent.
