The NM club met Nov 6th and chose an environmental area for their first project. The focus will be on recycling and reusing books through a drive or a partnership with "little libraries".












Grants Committee

Beginning Nov. 7, community 501 c 3 non-profit organizations will be able to submit a Letter of Inquiry to begin their grant application process. The organizations are asked to review and follow the Guidelines for Grant Making found on our Club's website, or by <u>clicking here</u>. The Letters of Inquiry are due by Dec. 13. The Grants Committee will meet in January to review all letters. Non-profit agencies who are selected to submit a grant application will be notified by Jan. 15 and grant applications will be due by Feb. 28.
