

COVID-19 Update

From Kathy Moore:

Cumulative cases in Muskegon County through 9/24/20:

Total cases - 1416 Recovered - 1184 Deaths – 68 (+2 others) Current/Active position – 162



Muskegon County is doing great! We would like to level out the current/active positive cases to about half the amount but we should consider ourselves very successful overall. Some concerns are migrant agricultural workers: 34 came to Muskegon County to work on a local farm from Mexico and before getting to work they were tested with 12 tests back positive. We are down to one death for September. It is always sad to have any deaths but this is the lowest number since COVID-19's inception.

Out of the correctional facilities, the difference is the management and safety precautions by the wardens with the number of cases (a clear difference). Our local schools K-12 have NO major incidents or outbreaks and are doing an amazing job. Way to go, Muskegon County!

It has been an interesting year; however, and Jon brings us inspirations and greetings from the first German Rotary International President, Holger Knack.



Born and raised in Midland, Michigan, Jon became involved with Rotary in 1985 as an exchange student sent to Finland. He graduated from MSU and started work with Chemical Bank in 1991. Joined Rotary in 1994 by Youth Exchange officer, then moved to

Washington DC in 1996 and joined another Rotary club there. When he moved back to Midland in 1998, he rejoined the Midland Rotary Club and was President Elect when his bank asked him to move to Cadillac in 2005. There he joined the Rotary Club right away again and it helped him meet the leaders in the community. When he became more involved at the board level, he felt that he truly became an involved Rotarian: hosting exchange students, visiting other clubs, became involved in the District, served as an Assistant Governor, District Treasurer, and now as the District Governor.

Jon challenged our group with making membership memorable, getting more involved, becoming more engaged/focused, and striving toward innovative ideas.

He has attended two international conventions and will be attending Taipei, Taiwan, with his son, Nick, who is an exchange student there. He is married to Jenny and they have a newly-married daughter, Sara (husband Derek). He enjoys outdoor activities, reading, exercise, and will rarely wear a tie.

Jon challenged our group with making membership memorable, getting more involved, becoming more engaged/focused, and striving toward innovative ideas. With the difficulties of the year, the challenges of lack of connection, time, information overload, and succumbing to status quo behavior should be confront headon. Jon continued with, "How can we make what we are doing today be more relevant going forward?"

Our Muskegon Rotary Club is amazing but how does our community know? Jon reiterated showing a fun side to the marketing, keeping it current, and also showing the end result/finished product too. Jon and the other Rotary leaders consider this year the year of

maintaining and stated not to get discouraged. An idea that came from other clubs was a focus of caused-based club/committees this year (for example, the cause to end human trafficking club/committee). Another idea was looking at different ways if we need to.

Now is a great time to take advantage of this. Don't do a fundraiser because you feel it's the status quo; try something new and innovative and you may have more fun while getting better results. The call was also announced to start focusing on a strategic plan on where we want to be in one year and also in five years. Jon gave us two quotes, "Start where you are. Use what you have.
