# THIS WEEK'S PROGRAM: Inbound Exchange Students

Our Rotary Club is indeed lucky to host a great group of international exchange students this school year. They've been in town just a couple of months but it's clear they're getting accustomed to the greater Muskegon community and life in America.

At our Oct. 19 meeting, we heard from Dori Szekeres of Hungary (attending North Muskegon), Kyoka Tomoyama of Japan (attending Reeths-Puffer) and Andres Amaya of Colombia (attending Mona Shores). A fourth student, Tomas Uruena of Colombia (attending North Muskegon), was ill and could not attend.

Each of the "inbounds," as we call them in Rotary parlance, provided information on their family, their hometowns and an overview of their country. While each of them had varying levels of English proficiency, it was very clear they are getting involved with their schools and enjoying their time in America.

Upcoming Halloween trick or treating is an American event they're all looking forward to. Said Dori: It's almost Halloween and I'm so excited!"

They each said they are enjoying their host family and have been busy at school. For Dori, she's involved with choir; Andres is in the marching band and Kyoka is cheerleading. They all said they're making friends among their classmates and hope some of them blossom into life-long relationships.

They were asked what American stereotypes they had coming to the U.S. and how this compares to reality. Kyoka, who was wearing a traditional Japanese kimono for her presentation, said Americans are more friendly than she expected. "Muskegon people are very, very friendly...like the compliments I got today on my kimono."

Each of the students were proud of their home country. Andres promoted Colombian's java, saying "Brazil may be the country with the most coffee production, but Colombia has the coffee with the best flavor...did I mention my dad owns a coffee farm?"

When asked about their musical tastes, Dori admitted to being a Taylor Swift fan. When showing a picture of various Japanese foods, Kyoka pointed to one of the items and said "I do miss Japanese food. I sometimes ate this three times a week!"

Walter contracted polio at age one, lost his ability to walk but eventually, with his mother's determination, regained the use of his legs.

He went to college at Milwaukee School of Engineering before serving three years in the US Army.

He married his wife in 1972 and together they raised their two children eventually moving to Michigan.

He started his career as a draftsman at Fiat-Allis, design engineer at

Haworth, and retired from Knoll as a Lead Senior Design Engineer.

He realized a dream when he was certified as a PADI Scuba Diver and explored many Great Lakes shipwrecks, Caribbean reefs, reaching the certification of Master Diver.

At 50 he first began acting with community theater in Muskegon and Grand Haven.

Later he joined local cycling groups and besides Michigan, cycled across lowa, Idaho, Ireland, Mallorca, Spain and Japan.


