Even though we are a large club, we get to know each other. Beyond just the surface of what we do for a living and where we come from, we get to know the value each of us brings to the whole.






Bob Landman (1933-2022), a talented architect and creator of modern living spaces, was a longtime serving Rotarian and friend to all. The signature SPX building was one of his noteworthy designs along with many "Landman houses." Bob remained eternally upbeat and was a lifelong learner. He loved watching Lake Michigan sunsets with his wife "Josie". At the luncheon to honor Bob were son Eric Landman, daughter Jodi Landman, and son-in-law Ken Dail.



Orville Crain (1950-2022) never met a stranger. A true "go-getter" for Rotary, he embraced all things Membership at the Club and District levels. He was the inventor and a founder of Klever Kutter. Orville loved his family, especially the grandkids. He was a booster of community arts and non-profits, especially tackling racism and equity causes. In attendance at the memorial was wife Susan Crain.



Mort Kantor (1930-2024) lived his life with kindness, humility and integrity. He was a respected dentist and community contributor. Mort was a Paul Harris Fellow and Harbor Hospice Hero Award recipient. Outside of work, Mort was a devoted husband and father and a competitive racer who loved the water and his boat, *Chicken Soup*. Mort's daughters Lisa Vitale and Debbie Blandford were in attendance.



Sue Wierengo (1931-2024) was the first woman to be president of Muskegon Rotary (1999-2000) and a Paul Harris Fellow. Known for her energy, dedication and great sense of humor, Sue was a civic leader, leadership academy guru, and hospice pioneer at the local and state levels. She loved to share stories of her children and grandchildren and treasured lake front living on Mona Lake and at Pere Marquette Beach.

Jason Bertoia (1979-2024) had infectious smile and joie de vivre. He was Managing Director of Muskegon Civic Theatre for 6 years and provided stage management and tech crew services for Muskegon Rotary Club meetings. Jason had a long connection to the theatre and performing arts community and formed lasting friendships through this work. Attending the memorial were Jason's significant other, Nathan Johnson, and his mother, Kathy Bertoia.



Lisa Metzdorf (1952-2024) had a successful career as a nurse leader at Hackley Hospital and area hospices with a second career in real estate. A

kind and sensitive woman, she was drawn to collaborative projects. Lisa shone as Rotary membership chair and volunteer for Pours for Community, the American Cancer Society and Camp Catch-a-Rainbow. She was proud of her three talented sons, two of whom were able to join the memorial program: Scott and Dylan.



Bill Johanson (1943-2024) had a 33year career at Consumers Energy, retiring as Lakeshore Area Manager in 2003. Bill's affable, multi-talented and generous spirit endeared him to all who met him. He was the long-term editor of Muskegon Rotary's highly acclaimed RIM newsletter and a Paul Harris Fellow. Bill loved to camp and kayak with his family, which he immortalized with his trusty camera. An avid musician, Bill played bass guitar or saxophone in five bands for nearly 50 years. Attending the program were Bill's wife Kris Johanson and daughter Carrie Kelly. Following the slide show and touching narrative, attendees were invited to Rotary Park for a memorial ceremony.


The theme for the 25th


