This week's program: Rotary Orientation



Speaker: Howard Hardesty Introduced by: Melissa Horton Reporter: Kathy Moore

Howard Hardesty presented an abbrieviated version of the monthly

orientation meetings with a bolt of energy, flood of information, and boisterous gestures. The program encompassed slides from the monthly orientation meetings and highlighted Rotary's history, governance, avenues of service, and

membership expectations. Hardesty

informed us that Rotary was founded in 1905 by Paul P. Harris in Chicago and has grown into a vast network of clubs with over 1.2 million members in more than 35,000 clubs across over 200 countries and regions. Hardesty furthered explained that the Rotary Club of Muskegon is part of District 6290; which is

comprised of 54 clubs with more than 2,400 members. And it's a big deal that our very own **Brianna Scott** was elected to serve as the 24/25 District 6290 Governor. Another interesting fact shared by Hardesty is that our local club was formed in 1916, which wasn't long after Rotary was first founded. Examples of our local club activities that align with Rotary's Five Avenues of Service (club, community, vocational, international, and youth) were provided.

Then Hardesty summarized the round-robin-sharing that occurs during the routine orientation meetings, and reenacted how he was coaxed into running the slide presentation at his own orientation session. Ultimately, this led to Hardesty leading and chairing

the orientation meetings, agendas, activities and processes for the next 15 years – to this day. The audience was not sympathetic because Howard is obviously a great fit and it was exceptional foresight to place him in this

Hardesty concluded the Rotary Orientation overview with an outline of privileges, obligations and expectations of Rotary Club membership. He emphasized key elements such as participation, attendance, and support through dues and donations.
