# **COVID-19 Update**

**Kathy Moore**: 2,023 cases to date with 1,057 recovered. We will continue to see COVID 19 cases, but Muskegon County is making progress in keeping that number fairly flat with only a few small spikes.



\*Ages 20-29 is the largest growing population and highest death rates in the age group of 80+. 46.1% male, 58.2% female, 56% white, 32% black, 8% Hispanic

\*Schools have opened and no noted outbreaks to date (2 or more cases linked via epidemiology)

\*Two correctional facilities in Muskegon, 0 noted cases at Brooks with inmates and 4 staff persons have tested positive. Muskegon has significantly more positive cases, including the staff.

# This Week's Program: Muskegon Community College and Baker College Facilitated by DJ Hilson



Dr. Dale Nesbary, MCC and Aaron Maike, Baker College

Both colleges are noting a dramatic shift with the number of students that are attending Baker and MCC under the Muskegon Promise. They are seeing more and more students staying in the community to attend Baker and MCC, and the Muskegon Promise is adding to the excellence in number of students transferring to four-year colleges from Muskegon. Our students are doing well and performing better than students transferring from other community colleges. The Muskegon Promise is making MCC and Baker College much more affordable for students and the quality of instruction is first rate; especially with the nursing programs.

"We are seeing more and more students staying in the community to attend Baker and MCC, and the Muskegon Promise is adding to the excellence in number of students transferring to fouryear colleges from Muskegon."

Both Baker and MCC are reinvesting money into the Muskegon Promise and students needing scholarship money. Both colleges are safe and affordable, as well as providing exceptional services to students. Baker and MCC are willing to partner with the community regarding getting more students to attend post high school education, especially to many families that do not have a history of secondary education.

Both Dale and Aaron have a goodnatured relationship and work very cooperatively to support one another and market for each other. They work hand in hand to offer a variety of programs and courses that complement one another and not compete against each other. MCC is known for their nursing program, music programs, and engineering and manufacturing; while Baker is also known for nursing and their culinary institute downtown. Both presidents noted that COVID-19 has really changed the focus of these education institutions; very few students on campus, more virtual/online classes and instruction, and the internship experience for students. Both colleges reported that enrollment has dropped significantly since the inception of the COVID-19, but have adjusted and planned for this drop and are doing well financially.
